Vincent Charlot, a man who resembles a blond James Dean with a cigarette hanging from his mouth, is one intense dude. Vincent descends from a long lineage of family cooperatives. Passionate and eager to take on the challenge, he bought a press and took over the family business in 2001. With only four total hectares, in six communes with 33 parcels, Charlot has become a master of organic and biodynamic viticulture. To spend the afternoon with Charlot, means you will not only witness his remarkable knowledge of the complex microcosm that are his thriving vineyards, but also you will see the rich biodiversity that populates them, including various species of strawberries and carrots that grow wild, bees pollinating the lavender bushes and mushrooms that sprout between the vines as if to boast its healthy terroir. It is not only a visual experience, but a spiritual one as well.

Ponson - Montagne de Reims - Champagne



The young and idealistic Maxime Ponson's organic wines are unique to his taste and demonstrate his strong belief in Pinot Meunier, the backbone and structure of most of his wines. His preference is for more ripe grapes and is not concerned about potential acidity losses in warmer years because the wines have other components that bring balance. He and his younger brother, Camille, work their family's vineyards in La Petite Montagne, a sub-section of Champagne's Montagne de Reims, located west of Reims. La Petite Montagne is home to some regional luminaries and top talents, like Prévost, Brochet, Savart and Egly-Ouriot. Maxime's wines are authentically him and that's one of the many things I love about them. He explained, "I'm sure that I don't produce the best wine in the world. But I produce my wine, and they have my identity and the identity of my terroirs." His wines are indeed superb and we are proud to represent this humble and talented vigneron.

Château de la Morandière - Muscadet - Loire

After six years of enology school in Nantes, the humble Alexandre Déramé began to run his family estate winery. Although his total production is considered medium sized, his yields are amongst the lowest in Muscadet and his Vieille Vignes bottle quantities are miniscule. His latest venture is to convert his vineyards to organic farming—a daunting task for a two person show. Morandière is a tiny commune in the gentle rolling hills in the region named after the village, Mouzillon, one of the most highly regarded wine villages in Muscadet. Mouzillon is distinctive for its soils high in concentration of Gabbro, a metallic-flecked, pale green and black, hard volcanic stone developed through slow cooling of basaltic magma is mixed with a loamy soil and orange-colored silex and quartz-like rocks. It's a very unique place that gifts the wines with tremendous power and tension.

Patrick is something a bit out of a JRR Tolkien novel—perhaps an aspiring wizard, which he may already be. His wines are somewhat magical in expression. The vineyards are certified but well beyond the typical organic practice. Patrick is more like a guru and is not short on opinion when it comes to the winemaking practices of other estates when driving around to visit his. His whites made exclusively from Chenin Blanc reveal layer after layer of savory notes of fruits, dried herbs and grasses, acacia honey, and spices all woven together on an ethereal wavelength. He is a musician turned maestro, conducting his vines to deliver soft, beautiful and tranquil music. His 13.5 hectares of vineyards are located in Anjou and the Côteaux du Layon, which are situated on the great terroirs of the Anjou Noir—named after the dark-colored ancient metamorphic and volcanic rocks of the Massif Armoricaïn that often date beyond 400 million years.

Romain Guiberteau - Saumur - Loire

There are many who make wines from their head, and less that make it from their heart. Romain Guiberteau is both, but the heart is his ultimate guide. Electricity and high-frequency is the game here and you'd better be ready to get your socks blasted off when you pull the cork on one of these white puppies. Romain and a group of other producers come from a very special hill, named Brézé. A little secret about this estate is that while everyone seems to be talking about his whites, we believe his reds to be some of the crowning jewels of Loire Valley Cabernet Franc. The climatic nature of Saumur combined with the dense and shallow limestone soils has, throughout time, yielded superb sparkling wine. The electric and compacted wines of Guiberteau have exemplified the energy of Brézé. The recent rediscovery of this hill's potential has stirred up the Chenin Blanc scene and is nearly rewriting the expectation for the heights that Chenin can achieve.

Stater West - Saumur - Loire

There are a lot of nice guys in the world, but few could be described as more genuinely nice than Brendan Stater-West. One might ask how a young American guy from Oregon with no winemaking history ends up in Saumur as the assistant vigneron to Romain Guiberteau, one of the most celebrated vignerons in the Loire Valley. It started with a job in a Parisian wine store where Brendan first tasted a bottle of Guiberteau. Fortune brought the young man a wonderful French wife, and they moved to Saumur where he asked Romain for a job. Romain agreed, a move that proved to be beneficial for both. Instinctually driven in the styling of his unique expression of Chenin Blanc and self-regulated by great humility and an openness of process, Brendan has the right ingredients to become a terrific vigneron. The soils for his wine is Tuffeau, a limestone soil made of 80% calcium carbonate from marine sedimentation and 20% sand. This sandy component is great white wine soil.

Arnaud Lambert - Saumur - Loire

The rise of Arnaud Lambert is no surprise. Since our wines from the 2010 vintage, his potential was obvious—not only with what skills he already possessed, but how clear it was that he would sharpen them and grow into the spectacular talent he has become. What's most incredible about Arnaud is his ability to churn out such quality with nearly twenty different cuvées rendered from more than forty hectares of vineyards. His wines are spectacularly etched jewels, short on pretension and confection, and long on harmonious depth and purity. Everything from his entry-level reds whites is astounding within its price range, and the upper class of the range developed for more time in the cellar are striking and warrant exploration for any serious Loire Valley wine enthusiast. Domaine Arnaud Lambert, a relatively new name, was established through the merger of two labels in 2017: Domaine de Saint-Just and Château de Brézé.

Francois Crochet - Sancerre - Loire

Meeting François for the first time reveals an intense but shy vigneron. Once asked a question about his wines, his bright blue laser eyes dig in and his mouth moves a mile a minute. François graduated from the famous enology school in Beaune, France. After school, he cut his teeth by working at Domaine Bruno Clair. François took over his father's winery not too long ago and has been turning heads everywhere, first in France and now here. He is one of the first to pick in Sancerre so the acidity of his wines rage, without the green notes. The Sancerre region sits on top of a series of hills and small valleys that were once under the ocean. The ocean deposited all sorts of calcium rich shells from ancient sea-life. In the case of Sancerre, the rock and soil is a mixture of limestone marl, chalk, flint and variations of light to heavy clay, giving a broad range of style amongst the appellation.

Chateau de Tracy - Pouilly Fumé - Loire

The renowned Pouilly-Fumé estate, Château de Tracy, is one of France's most historic and has been owned by the same family for more than six hundred years. The estate vineyards were replanted in the 1950s with massal selections from their vineyards—suggested by Maxime Bourret, the château's wine director, to be the oldest DNA of Sauvignon Blanc known in the Loire Valley. The culture in the vineyards is done with organic methods and treatments without certification due to disagreements concerning the overall lack of thorough examination by the governing bodies who confer these credentials. Work in the cellar is done with the intention to highlight their clay-rich, kimmeridgian marl and silex bedrock terroirs. The first Pouilly-Fumé in the range, "Mademoiselle T," is made in a more fruity fashion, while the "Château de Tracy" is more serious and maintains a greater depth of complexity. The "Haute-Densité" is from a kimmeridgian marl and clay vineyard with 17,000 vines per hectare (it's now illegal to plant so many vines per hectare), and it's a wine of magnitude and core strength. The recent addition of Menetou-Salon wines to their range from "Madame des Fontaynes," is worthy of exploration from this singular estate also on kimmeridgian marl bedrock and clay topsoil.

Jean Collet - Chablis - Burgundy

At age twenty-one, Romain Collet took over the entire estate and began to make decisions in the cellar. His father, Gilles, was forced into early retirement due to nerve damage in his leg and back. Immediately upon taking the reins, Romain began to experiment with organic and biodynamic farming as well as using natural yeasts. His relentless desire for improvement powers the future of Collet, which continues to inch closer with each vintage toward the elite of Chablis. The Collet style finds themselves right in the middle of two schools of thought regarding Chablis. One advocates for stainless steel tank aging out of the belief that the purity of terroir is best expressed unadulterated by oak, and the other is based around the needs of oak to soften its taut acidic structure and to sculpt wines that are grown in deeper clay soils. The Collets compromise by using older wood barrels in their higher end wines grown on richer soils and stainless steel with their most mineral and precise wines.

Christophe et Fils - Chablis - Burgundy

Sebastien Christophe is the man of mystery in Chablis. He comes from nearly nowhere and has quietly been climbing the ladder of Chablis stars. His winery is out of town and next to Petit Chablis vineyards that are upslope from the Grand Crus and a few of the famous premier crus he works with. Chablis can be a wine that expresses its terroir more clearly than any other region in the world. The winemaking choices certainly influence the impression of the wine but they never really lose that unmistakable Chablisienne character imprinted by its special limestone soils, the Chardonnay grape and tense acidity that is encouraged by a cool continental climate.

Dominique Gruhier - Epineuil - Burgundy

In 2012, this historic estate celebrated its 800 anniversary under the direction of the highly motivated Dominique Gruhier. Dom took over this estate in 1990 and eventually found his way to organic practice and certification by 2010. Moved by the results of converting to organic practice, began a full renaissance of the estate, which now produces a stunning range of wine from the nearly forgotten red Burgundy appellation outside of Chablis, called Epineuil. Epineuil is a tiny commune of only 100 hectares located in the Tonnerrois region in northern France, making it a very cool winemaking region. The famous Kimmeridgian limestone soils, like that of Chablis, combined with a unique microclimate, facilitate very good growing conditions for Pinot Noir and Chardonnay.

Thierry Richoux - Irancy - Burgundy

Once in a great while you stumble on a hidden gem, even one that has been in plain sight for decades. My first meeting with Thierry was one of my most eye-opening experiences. He is gentle, thin and soft-spoken with amazingly powerful hands that look like they could crush you with very little effort. This gorgeous village of Irancy is tucked in at the bottom of a very small amphitheater about 20 minutes from the center of Chablis. It shares the same basic geology as Chablis: Portlandian limestone on the upper sections and Kimmeridgian limestone inside of the sloped areas. Irancy is a special climate for Pinot Noir because of its horseshoe shaped amphitheater that faces south, west and north and holds in enough heat to just barely do the job.

One could say Bruno Clair is a vigneron's vigneron. His wines are loved worldwide by those lucky enough to know them. But truly impressive is the respect he garners within Burgundy, where his fellow growers consider him one of the greatest of their ranks. They admire his attention to detail in the vineyard, his organic practices (even if he doesn't bother with certification), and the long hours he and his crews put in. In the cellar, along with his longtime oenologist Philippe Brun (they have been called the Batman and Robin of Marsannay), Bruno produces wines that are loved for their purity of expression. They show no ego or even style, but simply seem to be true to the essence of each individual vineyard.

This is a moment importers and wine lovers wait for: the changing of the guard. After graduating from the University of Bordeaux with a degree in Engineering and Viticulture-Enology, Amélie Berthaut quickly began a relatively peaceful transfer of power from her father, Denis. Her father's wines speak the language one would imagine Burgundy wines did centuries ago and her first vintage, 2013, at age 25, is a significant departure from her father's in that they are ethereal and bright. Organic and sustainable practices are employed and like Amélie herself, her wines combine youthful elegance, purity and honesty, while shining brightly and radiating a natural charm.

Georges Noëllat - Vosne Romanee - Côte de Nuits

Maxime Cheurlin was just 20 years old when he took over this domaine in 2010. Seven years on, the promise he showed at that tender age has been more than fulfilled. Maxime can claim a rather impressive heritage. The domaine's namesake, Georges Noëllat, was the nephew of Charles Noëllat, who once held one of the greatest domaines in Vosne-Romanée. The estate is small with 5.5 hectares but includes some heavy-hitting vineyards in Vosne and Nuits. Vosne-Romanée, the host village for the majority of Maxime Cheurlin's holdings, has some of the most special terroirs in Burgundy. Under Maxime's hand, the wines exude the archetypal elegance and refinement that Vosne-Romanée is so famous for, with a slightly more understated touch.

Digioia-Royer - Chambolle Musigny - Côte de Nuits

This is not your nouveaux metrosexual Burgundy. It is one of our more underground, tiny producers that has developed a strong cult following. The range of wines crafted by the hands of Michel Digioia-Royer are fleshed out with earth and flowers, as opposed to sweet fruit and overly polished tannins. Based in Chambolle-Musigny, the estate has a large supply of old-vine parcels that lend to the depth of the range of wines. They are some of the more forceful and intense wines out of this village known for its elegance; they are not wines for immediate pleasure. Give them time to develop their entire range of complexities with plenty of time in the glass. It will be worth it!

Much like his brisk improvement in David's English, the quality and integrity of his wines and vineyards have advanced at a rapid pace since he took over in 1991, while still attending winemaking school. In 1999 he abandoned conventional farming and by 2006 was completely organic. An overhaul of his vineyard protocol was a dramatic step that allowed an evolution in his winemaking style, which has become more sensitive, more precise, in an attempt to articulate a more intimate engagement with his terroir. Over the last five vintages or so, he extracts less, uses less oak and has increased his percentage of whole cluster fermentations. These changes and the beauty of the plots he purchased from Jacky Truchot (now-retired, but in his day a vigneron with terrific collection of very old vineyards and a cult following of Burgundy lovers), David's wines are turning the heads of both his colleagues in Burgundy and wine lovers around the world.

Most of his holdings are located in the so-called secondary appellation of St. Aubin, with only a few wines outside of the appellation. What Olivier is able to accomplish in Saint-Aubin makes you wonder what he could do with prime spots in Meursault, Corton-Charlemagne, the Montrachets, or even Chablis! Olivier is intense, and his wines are the same. It used to be said that his wines are expensive for St. Aubin, but for wines this great, I say they are the best deal in Burgundy. For us, he is as special as it gets. Sadly, the quantities of his wines that we get are minuscule and high demand for the wines worldwide make it difficult for anyone to acquire much.

In 1989, after returning from business school in Paris, Caroline L'Estimé took over the winemaking and vineyard direction from her father, Jean-Noel. Since then she has climbed to the upper echelon of the great white burgundy producers. She has some of the best premier cru sites, as well as a small parcel of the great grand cru Batard-Montrachet. Caroline's wines have a woman's touch, show beautiful minerality and a consistent subtlety—details that often get lost in the powerful and blocky white wines of Chassagne-Montrachet. Situated on another hill to the south of the Grand Crus, lies a set of vineyards that make up Chassagne's well-known powerful and dense white Burgundies.

The wines at this domaine find a level of Savigny-les-Beaune that many may think not possible with this appellation. Domaine Simon Bize was under the direction of Patrick Bize for 20 years or so. Sadly, during the harvest of 2013 Patrick unexpectedly passed away, at age 60. The future of this estate is somewhat unknown, but once you meet his wife, Chisa Bize, you know that the estate is in the good hands and healthy spirit. She has long been quietly involved with Patrick along the way, encouraging him in the direction of organic and biodynamic farming, principals that have been quietly applied to the estate for years. The appellation is cleft in two by a creek that once was a more torrent river. Between the north and south hills of Savigny-les-Beaune is a great study of what effect different soil types, aspects, valleys, combes, dejection cones, elevations and grade of slopes can have on wines that share close proximity and the same grape.

Domaine des Croix - Beaune - Côte de Beaune

Beaune is an overlooked appellation because of the dominance of the negociants, who own the majority of the land. David Croix brings a set of wines that will make you want to rediscover the appellation. The easy going and humble Croix is one of the great young talents of Burgundy. He is always open to discussing his work and his way of thinking, which is one of the reasons why he has come so far so fast. He makes wine focused around Beaune with many good 1er Crus, but he also has interesting parcels in the hill of Corton just to the north. Corton is a unique site in the sense that the hill rises to 330 meters and towers over other famous wine-growing villages that surround it on three sides. On this king's hill, David produces Grand Crus from Corton-Charlemagne and two reds from Corton.

During his time at this notorious estate, he converted both Domaine Leflaive and his own estate vineyards to biodynamic farming and winemaking starting in 1991 and officially recognized by 1997. He is responsible for producing some of the greatest white wines in the history of Burgundy. Pierre works closely with his daughter, Anne, as she has been groomed to take over the estate operations. Just like her father, she is quiet but when you get her going, she exudes a deep passion and an inviting energy. When you are in the vineyards with her, you feel her deep respect and a sort of maternal instinct and connection to them.

Upon taking over the family estate, David converted everything to organic farming and began more strict practices in the cellar. Historically known for its natural hot springs, this charming spa town makes up the southern end of the Côte de Beaune. The reds from Pinot Noir are the most important in the appellation, making up 75% of the production, with white wine from Chardonnay making up the rest. A relatively new appellation, recognized in 1970, combined with the skyrocketing prices in the Côte d'Or, Santenay is beginning to make a name for itself as a good quality, better-valued Burgundy.

It is always a pleasure to find a vigneron (especially in Burgundy!) that has been under the radar and is just beginning to hit their stride; Rodolphe is one of those. After starting in 1992, Rodolphe has amassed 8 hectares of vines in the Côte de Beaune and has upped the ante on everything he does. There are no chemical treatments for herbicides, pesticides or fertilizers and he follows the rhythm of the lunar cycle when moving his wines and making picking decisions. He plows his vineyards by horse and tractor to aerate the soils and to take out grasses and weeds. Rodolphe Demougéot has arrived and has begun turning heads in Burgundy, even the heads of the most revered estates in the region. Indeed, he doesn't carry the superstar terroirs in his range of wines, but the energy put toward getting the best out of his humble holdings is impressive and they deliver well above what is expected, even from the two important villages his wines come from: Pommard and Meursault.

Clos Salomon is a partnership between the most recent heir to the estate, Ludovico du Gardin, and his winemaker, Fabrice Perrotto. They are both very conscious about treatments in their vineyards and don't use any insecticides or herbicides. All of the work is done by hand, and the resulting yield is quite low, at nearly 2 tons per acre in a generous vintage. While this has the same limestone and clay based soils, the climate is cooler than the Cote d'Or, so the wines can be a little more fresh but Clos Salomon's Givry is proudly endowed with structure and full-throttle flavors from its gifted terroir.

Domaine Chardigny - Saint Amour - Beaujolais



In 2014, brothers Pierre-Maxime and Victor-Emmanuel took the reigns of the family vineyards in Beaujolais and St. Veran. First on the agenda was the conversion from sustainable farming to organic. The youngest brother of three, Victor (born in 1991) finished school with a degree in Enology and Viticulture and oversees all the vineyards and winemaking. Pierre-Maxime (born in 1986), the eldest, holds a degree in business and focuses on commerce when times in the vineyard and cellar are slow, (which seems to be never). The middle brother, Jean-Baptiste, although not officially involved at this time, has a degree in agronomy and is currently vineyard manager for Domaine Leflaive's biodynamically-farmed Macon vineyards. It's not difficult to imagine the bright future in store for these talented brothers working together, as their family domaine ascends in St. Veran and St. Amour. Geologically speaking, the transition from southern Maconnais to northern Beaujolais sees a change of soils from Jurassic limestones and clay to the acidic igneous and volcanic rocks of the Massif Central. Viewed from afar, the change seems abrupt, but up close the lines are less clear.

He is one of Becky Wasserman's longest standing growers in her extraordinary collection of domaines. The wines are made from very old vines (the average 60 years) and are gorgeous and refined, clearly wines that are made by a master vigneron. Michaud's vineyards spread throughout the rolling hills Brouilly, the southernmost cru village in Beaujolais. Though the wines can be diverse due to a wide variety of soils, more than your typical Beaujolais fruit bomb, they are often more mineral, meaty and floral in style than their brethren to the north.

He's spent most of his adult life working for his famous father, Jean-Louis Dutraive, and like his father's wines, his are gentle and fun, with seriousness brewing within. Thankfully, this apple didn't fall far from the tree. Wise beyond his years, Justin openly shares ideas with his legendary dad and follows his advice every step of the way. The relationship between them is one of mutual respect and admiration, so they seem like very good friends and are an absolute pleasure to be around. All of the momentum in popularity that has built up for Beaujolais over recent years has brought about an exciting time in the appellation. And while it's great to see newfound attention for the once quietly sung legends such as Lapierre, Metras, Foillard, and Dutraive (the elder), there's really nothing more exciting than watching the rise of a new batch of talented and idealistic young winemakers who let their respect for nature guide them in their craft.

It's never too late for a renaissance and nearing the age of 60, Jean-Louis Dutraive has done just that. After prying him for what has happened since 2010, there seems to be no other answer outside of pure inspiration and enlightenment. You get the feeling it was always there but has just emerged over the last years. This extremely humble and hard-working vigneron has unintentionally become an iconoclastic vigneron within Beaujolais. He has found his own unique style of winemaking and has pushed his wines to a place that knows no equal. Fleurie is perhaps one of Beaujolais' most elegant appellations. It, like the other crus of Beaujolais, is scrunched up in the north half of Beaujolais and are dominated by more complex soils: schist and granite. At Jean-Louis' Fleurie vines, the soil is granite; the exception being the Brouilly, which is on limestone. All vineyards are farmed naturally with EU organic certification.

Anthony Thevenet - Morgon - Beaujolais



Anthony Thevenet is a young vigneron with the fortune of playing with vines in Morgon that were planted as far back as the American Civil War, yes, 150-year-old vines. As he slowly builds up his production from his family's estate he spends his days working in the cellar of Jean-Marc Foillard, a job that followed an apprenticeship with another reputable producer, Georges Descombes. He works similarly in the vineyards like his teachers, without herbicides or pesticides, and works the soil around his vines by hand. He follows the principles of the natural wine movement but the wines remain strikingly clear from many flaws that adorn wines in this movement. The sandy and rocky soils, known as rotten rocks, of Morgon provide a certain structure and richness that is rarely matched by other crus. The famous hill of Cote du Py has a unique soil type that is mostly composed of schist, blue granite and volcanic rock produces the most powerful examples of Beaujolais. Morgon may be the Beaujolais' quintessential village.

Domaine Rousset - Crozes Hermitage - Rhone Valley

Stephane Rousset's underground status as one of the best producers in the Northern Rhone Valley is about to end. It wasn't too long ago, in what we like to call the age of extraction, that producers making elegant wines were lost in the shuffle. One of the most diverse appellations in France's Northern Rhone Valley, Crozes-Hermitage is also its biggest. Rousset's vineyards lie in its most northern communes of Erôme, Gervans, and Crozes-Hermitage (the village the appellation takes its name from). The soil types here differ greatly from the rest of the appellation. Here you find vines on steep granite terraces of the river's left bank, above the Rhône and tucked back behind the behemoth hill of Hermitage. Across the river, in Tournon, Rousset's two parcels of St. Joseph are on pure granitic soils. In our humble opinion, in this appellation few, if any, vignerons produce wines above this in class and elegance.

Physically lean and strong, with a jovial, unpretentious and generous personality, the gentle giant, Florent Viale, makes good wine too. Like many Frenchmen, he is a man of the world in spirit and longs for travel, adventure and contact with the outside world. The home of his wines are on and surround the hill of Hermitage, one of the most recognizable terroirs in the world. It's a south-facing amphitheater split into two distinguished sections with a gnarly, chunky granite outcropping on the western flank and a smooth layer-cake of glacier and river deposits on top of a much older formation of limestone. Hermitage produces some of France's most powerful and long-lived wines and Crozes-Hermitage the more immediate and accessible pleasures.

Father and son, Pierre and Jérôme Coursodon, produce stunning red and white St. Joseph wines in the town of Mauves. Pierre manages the vineyards while son, Jérôme, is at the helm of winemaking. Blood, sweat and granite, that is what these hills are made of. The establishment of the St.-Joseph appellation originally started with six communes in 1956 and was extended thirteen years later to twenty communes. The expansion of the vineyards of St.-Joseph now start below Condrieu and follows the right bank of the Rhône for forty miles and ends at Cornas. St.-Joseph is typically old soil from the Ardeche plateau of the Massif Central. The original six communes (Vion, Lempis, St-Jean de Muzols, Tournon, Mauves and Glun) which sit across from the region's most famous appellation, Hermitage, share the same basic granite soil as the western side of that famous hill and are considered the top spots in this appellation

A former Parisian fireman, and now the mayor of Gigondas (no joke!), Eric Ughetto took over the family's vineyards in the early 1990s. A small estate with only 15 hectares, it is operated almost entirely by he and his wife, Sophie. They do the vineyard work together, but have clear lines elsewhere: Eric makes the wine and Sophie runs the commercial aspects. Simon, their young son, is already being groomed to start the process of taking the reigns from his pioneering parents. It's no surprise here, just like in any serious estate, that Eric and Sophie stress the importance of their vineyards over all else. The domaine is consciously run without pesticides, chemical fertilizers or herbicides. Since their beginning they have utilized organic methods and are now certified. The wines are a perfect balance of rusticity with precision winemaking.

Jean-Paul Daumen, the 5th generation owner and winemaker of Vieille Julienne remains a committed student of wine; he is curious to no end and completely open to new ideas. He embraced biodynamics when he took over the family estate in 1990 which abandons all herbicides, fungicides, fertilizers and chemical products used in the vineyard along with the avoidance of all unnatural additions (including cultured yeasts) in the cellar, save SO2 which is only added before bottling. The soils that remain Châteauneuf-du-Pape are built for power (along with the southern French solar power) with their large amount of calcium-rich clay and sand underneath the alluvial quartzite rocks on much of the topsoil.

Domaine Jean David - Seguret - Rhone Valley

As the age of extraction continues to lose ground, producers like Jean David, who have been organically farming since 1979 and making elegant, low alcohol, whole cluster, unoaked wines from Grenache and other aromatic red grapes, will begin to emerge from unassuming southern French appellations, like Seguret. They make wines that have the balance of firm structure and gorgeous fresh, delicate and high-toned aromas that rarely find their way into Southern French wine. Seguret—"secure" in Provençal—is a small, ancient town tucked away in the hillsides of the Côtes du Rhône. The vines that surround the village to the east and south offer wines that are well structured yet fresh and elegant and undoubtedly stand the test of time. The climate is Mediterranean, influenced by the intense Mistral wind and the terroir is predominantly sand, alluvium, clay and limestone slopes around the village and poor arid, stony soils on the steeper hillsides.

Domaine Pique-Basse - Roaix - Rhone Valley

If Olivier Tropet had vineyards in appellations like Côte Rôtie, Cornas or Châteauneuf-du-Pape he'd be more likely to garner wide acclaim. It's hard to believe what he achieves within the relatively unknown village of Roaix. His range of organically made wines (certified since 2009) are as soulful as they are exquisitely crafted. The reds are savory, deeply flavored, trim and laced with a surprising amount of subtleties for the power they possess. Roaix sits in France's Southern Rhône Valley on the northeast side of the appellation just to the east and north of Rasteau and to the north of Gigondas, which sits just across the Ouvèze Valley. While it shares the same basic grape varietals as its better-known neighbors, there are a number of important distinctions between other appellations in this area and Roaix that make this tiny Côtes du Rhône village an interesting prospect for those who want less boozy southern French wines that still taste of their place.

When asked why they started a domaine in the Languedoc and not closer to their native northern France, the response given by Julien Zernott was simply that he and his wife, Delphine Rousseau, wanted less intense winters and brutally hot summers. In 2001 they began searching for a wine region in the south with high biodiversity, ancient vineyards, and a climate that could express the elegance more associated with France's northern wines. The Terrasses du Larzac checked each box. The Languedoc is the largest producing wine region in France and one of the most diverse, boasting soils from nearly every type of rocks one can imagine and a large range of microclimates and grape varieties. Unfortunately, mass-produced wines of the international style with higher alcohols and overripe flavors have hijacked the Languedoc's reputation. But the Terrasses du Larzac's unique terroir produces a unique style of elegant wine that seems like a foreigner when tasted with other Languedoc wines.

This is a second label for Chateau Rouët, a famous rosé producer in Provence. It comes from an area that has a cool climate and makes wines very fresh and friendly. All three wines, red, white and rosé, were undeniably great for the price. They won't change your life but you will be hard pressed to find something in this category with this price that can surpass this little gem. Settled in the heart of Frejus, Provence, Les Teres' beautiful vineyards are surrounded by forest and protected from the northern winds by the red rock mountains of Esterel. The estate has a few hectares of noble varietals planted on red sandstone and volcanic rock that is representative of the archetypal terroir of Frejus. At only 15 km from the sea, the vineyards benefit from the cool air that flows in from the Mediterranean.

Guillaume Reynier began his wine career in 2003 with the purchase of small vineyard plots directly north of Aix-en-Provence near one of France's many fairytale landscapes, the Parc Naturel Regional du Luberon. Organic farming is employed and he became certified in 2010. His vineyards are ringed by thickets of oaks, bramble, and garrigue, with thyme and rosemary growing on nearly every foot of open forest floor. The forests provide refuge from the deluge of intense Provençal sun, including its blinding reflection off the stark white limestones. As the sun sets, cool air and woody life creep in from the forests, invading the vineyards to provide biodiversity and a stronger diurnal change than most well-known regions in Provence. Limestones are scattered about with ancient scallop shells commonly mortared to them. In certain sections, just meters apart, soils randomly undulate from dark red, iron-rich clays, hard limestones and pure white, soft chalk outcrops.

Chateau Cantelaudette- Graves de Vayres - Bordeaux

In 1984, Jean-Michel Chatelier and his wife, Laurence, fell in love with his family's rundown, abandoned Château and its old, out of shape vineyards. From a young age, Jean-Michel was surrounded by the winemaking business and understood its inner workings, but decided to go to school and earn a master's degree in economic science. At age 30, and freshly married, the pull of the family history (and Laurence!) brought him back to his roots. The decision was made and they rolled up their sleeves and got to it. Jean-Michel's vineyards are located just to the west of Libourne, a village that borders the western edges of Saint-Emilion and Pommerol, the two greatest Bordeaux producing villages on the right bank of the Garonne River. The vineyard land is grown on variations of gravel, silt, sand and clay, in every soil distribution from sandy-loam, clayey-loam, loam, etc.—so pretty much every type of grain-sized particle and structure to describe a soil!

Gagnepain et Risoul Vins - Corsica & Southern Rhone



David Risoul and Emmanuel Gagnepain, two consulting enologists in France, decided to start a new and unusual project with some of their vigneron in 2014. It was a simple idea: buy grapes from the best organically farmed sites at a few of their top producers, make the wines in the producer's cellar and have it raised and finished according to their ideas and then bottle it at each domaine. Manu and David purchase their own barrels (all 500 liter), select each parcel and manage the wine with Manu's monthly visits to the estates. The vigneron love it because they get to compare their wines with those of another project with fruit sourced from their same vineyards that they farmed. But one of the caveats is that the specific source of the fruit remains anonymous to us—la belle inconnue! Emmanuel (Manu) Gagnepain is a well-known name among vigneron (and US importers) in France. He is the consulting enologist for more than 70 domaines (of which 90% are certified organic or biodynamic) and made famous by his influence over many of the greatest producers in Corsica, like Abbatucci, Vaccelli and Stiliccionu. The style of southern French wines he prefers is elegant, mineral and pure, and this is what can be expected from the wines bottled under this label.

Domaine San Micheli - Sartene - Corsica

Sartène is one of Corsica's best locations for Sciacarello, the red queen of Corsica, and it's home to the most historic domaine of the region, Domaine San Micheli, a producer who has recently begun to churn out some of the more fine and elegant wines on the island, owned by the same family since the 18th century. With the arrival of Baptiste Condemine, a winemaker from Beaujolais, and the well-respected and talented enologist, Emmanuelle Gagnepain, things have taken a serious turn in the right direction. After starting with renovations in the cellar, they began to move toward more natural methods in the vineyards, with the elimination of pesticide and herbicide—a triumph, considering how long they've been used in the area. Sartène is a granite land with a dry climate, both ideal to maintain the perfume and finesse of Sciacarello. The estate red comes from vineyard parcels of twenty-five years old, while the Alfieri Polidori comes from forty-year-old vines. Both blends are dominated by Sciacarello, with Alfieri Polidori at more than 90% with the remainder being Nieullucciu, while the estate red is 60% Sciacarello, with 30% Nieullucciu and 10% Carcajolo comprising the rest. Some consider this to be the most exciting new prospect on the entire island.

Domaine Pero Longo - Sartene - Corsica



As much an artist as an artisan, Pierre Richarme, the owner and vigneron of Pero Longo, finds harmony with nature. A self-made man and authentic individual, he built his own house, winery, restaurant, hotel, and began to practice biodynamic farming where he replanted his vineyards in 1994. Today, he works with his son, Quentin, a tall, wiry, steel-cable of a young twenty-something who returned from wine school with an open mind and ideas of his own to add to his father's creations. The Equilibre red is a blend of 40% Sciacarello, 40% Nieullucciu, 20% Grenache, and is raised in concrete eggs and vats—both also constructed by Pierre! His wines lead with strong earth and fruit characteristics and tend to be deep in X-factor. Pero Longo's XX Cuvée, a one-vintage, rare wine made of 100% Sciacarello, was said by many talented wine professionals to be one of the most complex and compelling wines they've had. While Pero Longo has a history of inconsistency, Quentin's arrival has brought about major change and things continue the upward climb.

Clos Fornelli - Corse - Corsica



Josée Vanucci's winemaking philosophy is straightforward and lends itself to a style that speaks of the place with a clear voice of each grape's primary characteristics. The fermentations are all natural and the wines are bottled after a short time in vat with sulfites kept to a minimum. Located on the eastern side of Corsica, on Tyrrhenian Sea, and not too far from mainland Italy, Vanucci's vineyards are up above the plains on the terraces of the Bravone River. The nights on this side of the island are typically cooler than the more famous wine regions on the west side. This is a result of the sharp rise of the mountains from the sea, which effectively cuts the sun off early and lets the cold in to help etch aromatics and texture while raising the frequency on the fruit and accentuating each wine's mineral nuances. Corsica is a wonderful, sunny island (sunnier than mainland France) and this terroir/grape combination gives lift to the high-spirited wines that Josée dreams up and captures in the bottle with a deft touch. The red is made 100% of Sciaccarello and the white 100% Vermentinu.

A. Peraccia - Ajaccio - Corsica



A bear of a man, Laurent Costa, the owner and vigneron of Domaine A Peraccia, is a one-man show. His organic and biodynamic wines mirror his high energy and warm personality. Rich in beguiling x-factors channeled by Corsica's queen red grape, Sciaccarello, and the iron-rich sandy granite vineyards soils, they are unexpectedly captivating and complex wines for modest prices. These low yielding reds (often between 1.5-2 tons per acre) are transparent in hue but maintain a full range of unique and compelling flavors replete with an unmistakable Mediterranean island character. It's no surprise that Laurent is ex-military; he's fully engaged, serious, intimidatingly intense and equally hospitable. When not standing still, he moves with urgency and gives off the impression that he hasn't a second to spare, which is likely true. He does all the vineyard work by himself on all ten of his hectares. It's hard to believe he runs everything alone because that's a tremendous amount of land to cover for one person. However, he moves fast and powerfully, and if anyone could accomplish this feat and make wines of such grace and power, it's clearly him.

No matter the current moda, the most authentic and interesting wines sing dialect and teach historical context, and invite our creative minds into their mystery—their bedrock and soil, their genetic heritage, the seasons and vintages, the surrounding woods, the life inside the vineyards and the dirt, and the echo of their nature-conscious ancestors. Their wines guide us into the fantasyland of their madness, and their genius. These are the wines of Andrea Picchioni. In the Oltrepò Pavese's DOC "Buttafuoco dell'Oltrepò Pavese," on the original Buttafuoco hill, Andrea crafts a unique and unapologetically full-flavored range of organic sparkling and still red wines from a mixture of Barbera, Croatina, Ughetta di Canneto (also known as Vespolina), and Uva Rara.

The realization of Michelangelo Ioppa's dream started in 1852 with the purchase some of the most prized vineyard parcels in Northern Piedmont, in what is today's DOCG, Ghemme. The new generation at Ioppa has their sights set on the past glories of traditionally crafted wines from this region, rebounding from more than a decade of experimentation with 225 liter oak barrels. They've returned to soft extractions and long aging in large, old foudre, and the top four reds in the range are aged in 30-35hl foudre for four years! The majority of the most important Alta Piemonte wine regions are set upon igneous rocks in geological origin, while Ghemme is mostly alluvium. Not all alluvium is the same, and Ghemme's unusual bedrock mostly consists of incredibly friable granite rocks; or what appears to be a rock, but can easily be crushed into sand with a gentle squeeze of your fingertips. The Ioppas have also begun the process of converting to organic farming in 2014.

Poderi Colla - Langhe - Piedmont

You cannot write a better story for an estate than this one. The Colla family has been involved in making wine in the Langhe since the very beginning of the 18th century. However, this is one of the newest estates in the region as it was started in 1994 by Tino Colla and his niece, Frederica, the daughter of the legendary winemaker, Beppe Colla (Prunotto owner and winemaker from 1956 – 1992). What is most interesting about this estate is that given the experience of owning Prunotto for over 30 years and vinifying nearly all the great vineyards of Barolo and Barbaresco, instead of buying many different crus with the money from the sale, they decided to buy three very specific estates: A six hectare plot in what Beppe Colla considered to be the finest vineyard that he ever vinified in Barolo, a significant property that is home to one of Barbaresco's great crus, Tenuta Ronconglie, and an even more historical site, Cascina Drago, which is home to one legendary Dolcetto wine that Tino claims will age effortlessly for 50 years.

David Fletcher - Langhe - Piedmont



The name Fletcher doesn't exactly evoke thoughts of classically styled Barbaresco. However, if tasted without the label in view, there's not a chance anyone would guess his Nebbiolo wines were the handiwork of a young Aussie. In fact, it wouldn't be a stretch if thought to have been crafted by a seventy-something winegrower in the twilight of their career, with an interpretation learned from decades of noise and experimentation, evolving into beauty, balance and a timeless, gentle melody. Dave's philosophy and practice with Nebbiolo is to simply have as little impact as possible and to demonstrate a full display of the talent in each vineyard by focusing on clarity and grace while building on the unmistakable nuances unique to Piemonte. His Barbera, however, is a contemporary of modern, natural Beaujolais wine made with more than a third of its whole clusters and with very little extraction semi-carbonic fermentation—a delicious and thoughtful use of this high acid grape that could use a different face or at least a makeover, on occasion.

Fabio Zambolin - Coste della Sesia - Piedmont



A true northern Piemonte garagiste, Fabio Zambolin inherited his grandparent's tiny vineyard parcels and converted their garage into a winery. He began his project in 2010 with a parcel that he works organically and that sits within the DOC appellation, Lessona. However, the cantina is ten meters outside of the DOC zone (right next to the vineyards) and an archaic law makes it so that he must label his wines Costa della Sesia, a generic term for regional Northern Piedmont wines. As one could imagine, with such a small quantity of grapes to make his wines the level of detail in his organically farmed vineyard and cellar are maintained to an extraordinary level. Famous Italian wine writers of the late 1800s and early 1900s considered Lessona wines the greatest reds in all of Italy, and in the right hands it can represent one of the most pure expressions of Nebbiolo. Fabio's Vallelonga is made purely of Nebbiolo, and Feldo, a blend of 50% Nebbiolo with equal parts of Croatina and Vespolina the difference.

After nearly an hour of winding through hills and lifeless villages north of Alba, the road suddenly climbs into forested hills and the humble driveway of the Russo family's cantina and agriturismo, Crotin, which in Piemontese dialect means small cellar. The three Russo brothers, Federico, Marcello and Corrado, are fully committed to organic farming principals, and their wines ooze the life force of their vineyards. Bread and butter grapes like Barbera, Grignolino and Freisa are the game around here and these guys play it with spectacular results. Over the last five years, they've brought their wines to a new level with direction from our very good friend, one of Italy's most promising young enologists, Cristiano Garella. The range of their wines demonstrate Cristiano's hawk eye for detail and authenticity, and makes this estate a sure bet for people who want to spend their time drinking a wine that speaks the dialect of where it comes.

Sorgente - Friuli - Venezia Giulia

Sorgente Prosecco comes from a small vineyard plot of only six hectares of Glera vines: there are no other grapes added to the Prosecco and all of them are estate owned. Located in Friuli-Venezia Giulia, the vineyards sit only a few hundred meters from the natural spring (called sorgente in Italian) at the nascita of the Livenza River. The proximity to the Alps (which begins no more than ten miles to the north) and the Adriatic (twenty miles away) brings an ideal temperature characterized by large diurnal swings from day to nighttime which is crucial for the development of complex phenolics, fresh acidity and elevated aromatics—all necessary for a proper Prosecco to remain true to form (bright, fresh, minerally) and function (pleasure over intellect). The vineyard soils are endowed with limestone and clay, both a mixture of the former salty marshland that existed here millions of years ago along with alluvial soils largely composed of limestone. From a pedigree standpoint, there is good reason that one would discover the mineral nuances of this "simple" Prosecco due to its soil composition and climatic balance. There are no herbicides and pesticides used in the vineyards, only vineyard treatments of copper and sulfur. After a rigorous selection process, they sell off more than 60% of their Prosecco base wine to negociants through their leaving a mere 40% off their six estate hectares for these two wines.

The old saying about the resemblance of a dog to its owner could also be said about a wine and its maker. Timid and soft at first, Vittorio is a humble man who reveals the fire of his passion only through his bright eyes and his uncontrollable smile. They spare no expense as they execute precision organic farming in tune with nature's rhythms, use minimal new oak and put very little hand in the wines. Quercia al Poggio is located in Barberino Val d'Elsa, smack dab between Florence and Siena. The Rossi's ancient property is positioned very close to two historical estates in Chianti Classico, Isola e Olena and the Castello della Paneretta. Their soils have a lot of limestone-rich clay with less abundant sections of galestro (a clayey schist soil and stone), a unique geological formation found in many regions of Chianti Classico.

Mauro Spertino is one of the most artistic and technical craftspeople in our entire portfolio. The diversity and skill demonstrated throughout his range forecast the inevitability that he will find his place among other wine alchemists in Italy whose unmistakable imprints are evident at first smell—Quintarelli, Bea and Soldera are names that come to mind. His reds range from bright and sensual, able to flutter and seduce (Grignolino), to more elixir-like and dark (Barbera wines), which mesmerize with a deep well of discovery in each smell and taste. Mauro toys with Cortese, a white grape from which he slowly extracts an orange hue, crystalline clarity and mind-bending complexity. His vermouth, Belle Epoque, carries a ballerina-like balance of power and grace. All that he touches from his Asti vineyards he makes into something dazzling and one of a kind.

After Dunkley passed away in 1996, Ferrini decided to move on the following year. He was surprised by the call from Alessandro and hadn't been back to Riecine since the day he resigned. "It had been almost twenty years and when Ferrini arrived, he had tears in his eyes. John and Palmira were like Ferrini's second parents. It was a great moment to have him back," Alessandro explained.

Quinta do Ameal- Vinho Verde - Portugal

The strikingly beautiful and serene Quinta do Ameal is in the heart of the Lima Valley, within Portugal's vast Vinho Verde wine region. The Lima Valley is the most northwesterly zone and borders the Atlantic Ocean to the west and is separated from Spain by the Minho River to the north. The altitude of the vineyards inside this east/west valley get higher to further west one goes, and the terrain becomes more uneven, giving rise to multiple micro-climates, with the Lima Valley perhaps the coldest and with the most precipitation. The Loureiro grape (the sole grape used in all of Ameal's wines) thrives in the vineyard's igneous granite bedrock and topsoil—the same bedrock that covers the majority of the valley, with the remainder variations of metamorphic rock. Ameal's wines here are made in neutral vessels (stainless steel for the entry-level wine, old barrels for the higher-end wines) and remain fresh, low in alcohol and extremely versatile with almost any kind of food from land and sea.

Fuentes del Silencio - Castilla y Leon - Spain

The story of Fuentes del Silencio is of Indiana Jones-level proportions for lost and nearly forgotten wine cultures. Miguel Angel Alonso and his wife Maria José Galera, retired doctors and hobby winemakers, have stumbled on and excavated one of the rarities of the wine world. In the south of Leon province, up on the high plains of Herreros de Jamuz, among forests and fields of shrubs, they discovered the ancient Mencia vineyards buried under grounds that predate the phylloxera epidemic. There they started a rescue mission, restoring many of the old vines and putting them back into production. Miguel and Maria developed a team of passionate wine professionals—who seem more like archeologists, and taken on the task of bringing this Spanish treasure trove back to its former glory with a minimalist approach in the cellar. The youngest vines of their collection of parcels were registered as planted in 1930, but the oldest locals told Miguel stories about their grandfathers planting the last set of vines closer to the turn of the century, after phylloxera had passed through. I've seen a lot of unique looking vines, but I've never come across anything that looked like hairy little square animals, dug into the ground, with vine shoots sprouting from their backs.

Manuel Moldes - Rías Baixas - Spain



One of the brightest lights in the slowly rising tide of the Rías Baixas, Manuel Moldes has an aptitude for finely tuned, deeply technical wine analysis, but it's his curiosity and open mind that guide him. Manuel's approach to his Albariño range is to have wines with notable differentiating characteristics; they either contrast the soil type altogether, whether it be completely on schist, the A Capela de Aios, or those granite parcels bottled as Afelio; or the particularities within a rock and soil type to illuminate their differences and are compelling enough to be bottled alone, like As Dunas, from sandy schist soil with no bedrock contrasts A Capela de Aios, grown on shallow schist topsoil with a soft schist bedrock. The simplicity of the red winemaking follows suit with the Albariños, but involves the art of blending different grape varieties from numerous terroirs into one wine. Acios Mouros, a blend of 60% Caiño Redondo, 20% Loureiro Tinto, 20% Espadeiro, is an extremely high-toned red from the Rías Bixas, and his Bierzo, a more supple red blended with 60% Garnacha Tintorera and 40% Mencia.

Terra Brava - Ribeira Sacra - Spain



Breogan (Breo) Rodriguez, a bagpipe player, spear fisherman, tile layer, former heavy metal rocker and one of the Ribeira Sacra's quietly rising stars, was a rebel as a child, and not much has changed. He's never been one to follow the rules, and his choice to forgo putting the now cult-famous DO (Denominación de Origen) Ribeira Sacra on his label is true to this spirit. The decision lets him follow his own ideas rather than adhering to the regional laws outlined by the DO, and his move is an increasingly common practice among winegrowers in Spain who find these wine laws antiquated and restrictive. Breo wants to explore less the well-known grapes (like Caiño Longo) that Mencia pushed aside simply because it's so easy to grow and produce high yields. The cult of rebellious personality aside, Breo might be one of the most friendly and gentle people one could come across in a lifetime. His wines are just like him in personality and stature (he's a lean wire of a man), and for a somewhat new winegrower he demonstrates an unusually precise touch in the cellar.

El Paraguas - Ribeiro - Spain

Wine journalist and winemaker, Marcial Pita, and award-winning and fourth generation enologist and viticulturist, Felicísimo Pereira, met while sitting in on panels for Spanish wine competitions. They found that they often picked the same wines as the best of each show and decided to team up in 2007 to begin their project. In 2011, they finally released the first vintage of their Ribeiro based garage winery, Bodegas Paraguas, and quickly caught the attention of the region and many of Spain's top sommeliers. One of Pereira's specialties has been mining the countryside for nearly forgotten grape varieties and bringing them into the conversation of Galician wines. Bodegas Paraguas works exclusively in Ribeiro and principally with the white grape variety, Treixadura (90%). They veer on the side of picking early and working with a mix of high elevation sites and work to respect nature by not using herbicides or pesticides, and doing everything by hand (or horse, in the case of plowing). The stunning results of their high-elevation and early picked wines closely resemble a wine from Burgundy's Côte d'Or in weight and complexity, but remain true to the taste of the Ribeiro, with honeyed citrus blossoms, saltiness and white fruits.

Cume do Avia - Ribeiro - Spain



Diego and his brother, Álvaro, grew up in Vigo, northwestern Spain's largest metropolitan and industrial area. The bustle of city life wasn't in their blood, so in their early twenties they embarked on the courageous restoration of vineyards with their cousins, Anxo and Fito, in an ancient Galician ruin where their ancestors once lived. They started their new lifelong adventure together in 2005 that ultimately pushed them to the brink of financial ruin and tested their relationships with each other and many of their loved ones. The vineyards are surrounded by dense forest and sit on the top of a hill (a Cume) above the river Avia. By 2008 they planted their first vines, and in 2012 finally made their first vinification "tests," as Diego calls them; it was the first time any of them had ever made wine. On the vineyard are thirteen different indigenous Galician varietals selected from ancient vines in the Ribeiro. "The past of these forgotten grapes has been erased, leaving no one to discuss the ideal practices for them. Much knowledge was discarded with the introduction of chemicals to the vineyards after the second World War and there is no manual or record. We are trying to reinvent and rebuild this lost history," Diego explained. In what they would consider their first real vintage, the 2017 wines are gorgeous and taut with energy. They are not to be missed by those interested in the rise of Galician wines.

Pedro Parra - Itata - Chile



Who would have thought it would be a Chilean from the industrial city of Concepcion that would become one of the most influential terroir specialists in the world? The unusually talented and enthusiastic Pedro Parra has taken on that roll as he consults for some of the world's greatest vignerons in France, Italy, as well as many other countries. He has a master's degree in precision agriculture and earned a Ph.D. for his work with terroir. His wines are distinctly Pedro: they're honest, intense, humble and have great personality. The magic of Chile's Itata Valley begins with its special 200 million-year-old granitic soils and dry-farmed bush vines principally planted with the reds, Pais (Mission grape) and Carignan, and the white grape, Muscat of Alexandria. Cool coastal winds and clouds keep the winegrowing season long, giving the wines great potential for developing the complexity needed for high quality wine.

Leonardo Erazo is a rare talent. After graduating from the University of Chile with a degree in Agronomy and Enology, he traveled the world for a decade working for various estates doing research in soil science, geology and biodynamics. We have worked with many winemakers over the years and few speak with as much humility and authority as he does, and on such a broad array of subjects that pertain to winemaking and viticulture. Leo's minimalistic style of winemaking and growing requires exceptional discretion on his part, combining some modern techniques with established traditions. He believes that the best dry-farmed ancient vineyards found in the Itata Valley require as little stylizing as possible to showcase the deep expression of their terroirs. While employing biodynamic principals, he uses the advice of the experienced local farmers who have been naturally farming this region for centuries.

Note on Wachau

The Wachau is arguably the most prestigious area in Austria. The impressive zone starts about 70 miles west of Vienna, in a town called Unterloiben, and runs along the Danube river for about 13 miles to the west ending in the town of Spitz. Unterloiben is on the warmest point of the Wachau while Spitz represents the coolest growing area. Gneiss is the primary rock which creates the division between Kremstal and the Wachau. Granite, mica, slate, loess, sand and crystallised lime are also present, but Gneiss is the decisive element that separates the highest quality wines from the rest. The Wachau is truly one of the greatest studies in terroir, as the wines are subject to intricate differences in microclimates as a result of surrounding forests and the Danube river. Soil diversity is clearly important here, but can be considered secondary to the climatic diversity.

The problem with Peter's wines is that there is too much to think about when tasting them, and they can be the most sublime and pure expression of any wine created on this planet. Peter Veyder-Malberg, or as I refer to him, Peter Pan, rages with ideology and a child-like enthusiasm for his vineyards. He is well beyond organic or biodynamic production with his thinking and spends his time cultivating positive working relationships with his insects or conversing with mushrooms and microorganisms that live in the root systems of his vines. Peter is a bit of a wizard and seems to have come from nowhere, or maybe, Neverland. In Peter's town in Austria's Wachau wine region, Spitz, Riesling and Gruner Veltliner thrive on the steeply terraced hills along the Danube River bank and principally grow on gneiss and loess soils.

Martin Mittelbach is a Wachau insider with an outsider's perspective. Martin took over the estate at a very young age and immediately changed the way things were done. As you could imagine, there was some friction with his father who preferred to make wines more on the sweeter side. Today, you would be hard pressed to find a more dry and straight style in the Wachau. The grapes are harvested and sorted rigorously to take out any botrytis grapes and then vinified and raised in stainless steel. They are harvested with no botrytis to keep the wines focused and tense. His wines are like his personality: intense, focused and highly intellectual. These laser beams are as far away from the often baroque style that can be found in this region. In every level his wines excel and can stand tall next to any of the greatest producers in Austria.

The Weszeli estate is situated in the Kamptal region of Austria, where the summer days are hot and the cooler Northwest winds bring the cold, causing high diurnal fluctuations. The soils are a mix of loess, gneiss, and clay and the long growing season and sunny autumn days allow the grapes to reach full physiological maturity.

Not only a devout biodynamic farming practitioner since 2006, Birgit Braunstein lives a biodynamic life. A single mother since the birth of her two sons, Felix and Max, she steadily and quite remarkably advanced the quality of her family estate. Her vineyards are an interesting mix of limestone, mica schist, and crystalline quartz, which offers her range of wines a great deal of breadth and depth, and a multitude of compelling textures and mineral/metal impressions to go with their overt charm and exuberant personalities. Her vineyards are in Leitha Mountains on a gentle, southeast slope facing Lake Neusiedl. Her Zweigelt “Mitterjoch” is grown on schist soil and fermented in stainless steel that further encourages Zweigelt’s naturally bright and fresh red qualities. Classically darker and more textured, her Blaufränkisch wines are grown on limestone soils. Heide—named after the vineyard—comes from young vines and spends one year in old barrels. Leithaberg, from the old vines of the Heide and Glauberza vineyards, has a lengthier wood aging and offers much greater complexity.

It is never easy to fill the shoes of a powerful and polarizing figure, like Gerald Malat, but Gerald’s tall, handsome and forever smiling son, is doing just that. The previous level has been elevating under Michael’s eagle-like eyes which have set him on his upward climb. At this estate, even the entry-level wines find absolute deliciousness and express enough intellect to enamor us wine geeks. Kremstal is one of the most recent DAC to be added to Austria. Founded in 2007, just west of the Wachau, this large appellation is divided into three significant zones. The most western part of the valley, near Stein, is primarily rocky soils, ideal for the elegant, yet intense, Riesling. As you move east toward Krems, deep loess soils cover the vineyards allowing Gruner Veltliner to express its highly aromatic and fresh nature. The third zone of the Kremstal is located on the southern banks of the Danube River, where some of the most pleasant wine villages are found.

Ingrid Groiss an old soul in a young body. Somehow, she is able to channel the energy of a young school girl and at the same time that of her overly active grandmother, to whom she gives gratitude for the existence of this family wine estate. Her grandmother kept alive vineyards that sit in the Weinviertel, just a stone throw away from the Czech Republic. The wines that Ingrid makes have the same vitality of both personas, the energy of youth and the wip-like intelligence and experience of a woman who has seen nearly the entire 20th century and maintained her optimism. Weinviertal, which literally means "wine quarter," is Austria's largest wine region, and is situated at the far northeastern part of Austria. Most of Ingrid's vineyards are on variations of limestone soils, but with the immensity of this region, climatic influences and geological compositions vary drastically.
