Behind every wine is a person and a philosophy.

Craftsmanship, passion, and ethics are our highest priorities with artistry and philosophy coming second. We work tirelessly to find producers who share these values, and after fifteen years of hands-on experience in winemaking and viticulture, and many more years in high-end restaurants, we've developed strong convictions about what defines good wine, good relationships, and good business. Needless to say, our expectations of the producers we choose to represent are high.

Since we began importing in 2010, we've visited the vineyards and cellars of each producer each year to better understand their wines and practices. Despite our generally optimistic outlook on life, we remain vigilant when selecting wines, always on the lookout for potential red flags that might go unnoticed by those with less experience in viticulture and winemaking.

We are particular about how we choose to live. Above all, we strive to ensure that what we put in our bodies is as natural and nutritious as possible. This extends to the wine we drink, which must be made with minimal additives to preserve both the terroir and the health of the wine. We've seen firsthand what gets dosed into commercial wines, and we don't want those things in our bodies — or anyone else's.

While most of our producers are certified organic or biodynamic by the European Union, certification is not a requirement for us. Dogma can sometimes hinder intuition, and we believe that the best wines are crafted by exceptional intuition. What matters is that the vintners are rigorous and mindful in their practices, willing to compromise their philosophies only in the most extreme situations. Indeed, many of our finest producers aren't certified, yet stepping into their vineyards reveals a vitality that rivals, if not surpasses, that of other certified vineyards.

We invite you to join us on our journey, not only to discover honest and soulful wines, but also the stories of the makers — people who bleed, sweat, and toil to create wines that bring more beauty to our daily lives.

All domestic producers & importers extend 30 days net payment terms. Credit applications must be completed and approved prior to delivery of wines. Discounts & allocated wines are not available to delinquent accounts. Accounts delinquent over 45 days past the shipping day will not be sold to until the account is brought to current. Any account delinquent over 60 days will be placed on COD or post dated check terms

DELIVERY

Zephyr Express Delivery Service delivers Tuesday through Friday in most territories. Any orders submitted after 2pm will not be available for next day delivery in SoCal and 5pm for NorCal.

Giovanna (to the right) and her sister Serena (left) took over the estate from their father, Piero, who founded today's generation of Agricola Brandini purchased in 2007 with vineyards high up in La Morra, Roero, and Alta Langa. Many of their sites on the northwest corner of La Morra were thought too be cool at the time to produce great Barolos, but today impart lift and balance.

From the very beginning the family moved everything to organics, certified by 2011, and the sisters have pushed even further with cover crops, minimal tillage, solar energy, and native fermentations. Across their 25 hectares, the combination of calcareous marl and sand produces Barolos with perfume and grace rather than sheer weight, wines that are approachable in youth but carry themselves easily for the long haul. Since stepping fully into leadership in 2018, Giovanna and Serena have stayed faithful to the Barolo traditions while keeping an eye on the shifting climate, crafting wines with precision, freshness, and a very human touch.

BEAUJOLAIS 'LES BULANDS'

\$288/\$24

Planted between 1971 and 1973, the two parcels that make up Les Bulands lie in Lancié. One parcel is east of Fleurie on a level surface of deep granite sand, silt, and clay at 200 meters of altitude. Added in 2019, “Moulin Méziat” is a south-facing, medium-sloped site of granite, silt, and clay. 100% whole cluster, semi-carbonic, natural fermentation and maceration for 4 weeks at 21°C max. and aged 6 months in enameled iron tank before bottling 15ppm (15mg/L) total added sulfites only at bottling. Neither fined nor filtered.

BEAUJOLAIS SAINT ÉTIENNE LA VARENNE “LES TOURS”

\$324/\$27

Planted in 1995, “Les Tours” lies 15 km south of Fleurie and 4 km south of Côte de Brouilly on a thin layer of sandy granite topsoil over granite bedrock on a mild east-facing slope at 300 meters of altitude. 100% whole cluster, semi-carbonic, natural fermentation and maceration for 3 weeks at 24°C max. and aged in 50% enameled iron tank and 500-liter old French oak with 10ppm (10mg/L) total added sulfites only at bottling. Neither fined nor filtered.

RÉGNIÉ “LES BULLIATS”

\$336/\$28

Planted in 1960 at the base of a mild east-facing slope, this parcel has deep topsoil composed of 55% granite sand, 35% silt, and 10% clay at roughly 275 meters of altitude. 100% whole cluster, semi-carbonic, natural fermentation and maceration for 4-5 weeks and aged in enameled iron tanks at 21°C max. with 20ppm (20mg/L) total added sulfites only at bottling. Neither fined nor filtered.

FLEURIE “LA MADONE”

\$480/\$40

Planted in 1970 on a very steep southeast-facing slope, the vineyard sits on thin, rocky pink granite topsoil with granite and quartz bedrock at 415–425 meters of altitude. 100% whole cluster, semi-carbonic, natural fermentation and maceration for 2-4 weeks at 21°C max. and aged 6 months in 3 old 500-liter French oak with 10ppm (10mg/L) total added sulfites only at bottling. Neither fined nor filtered.




NEW PRODUCER | U.S. DEBUT
QUINTA DE SAN MICHEL
COLARES & LISBOA
(AVAILABLE FROM THE SOURCE IN ALL U.S. MARKETS)



Colares holds one of Portugal's oldest vineyard legacies, with documented references back to 200 BC and Malvasia de Colares recorded in the 19th century. By the phylloxera era, Colares gained a reputation as one of the few European regions spared, its vines rooted in meters-deep sand layered over limestone and clay, unreachable by the pest. Even at its peak, Colares never exceeded 1,800 hectares, and by the late 20th century had dwindled to around twenty, threatened by Lisbon's urban expansion, mildew, shifting preferences, and the ease of nearby Alentejo. Its mythology rests not only on its survival but on its distinct wines: Ramisco, the sole permitted red, known for high acid and firm tannins, and Malvasia de Colares, whose waxy textures, salinity, and age-worthiness are unlike any other. Quinta de San Michel, with vineyards in both Janas and Colares, is part of this story of resurrection, reclaiming a nearly vanished viticultural Eden on the edge of the Atlantic.





The vineyards of Janas and Colares sit on a geological crossroads: Jurassic limestone and clay form the foundation in Janas, while the valley of Colares is overlaid with windblown sand from the past 2.5 million years. These sands, quartz-rich and sometimes dusted with volcanic grains, insulated Colares from phylloxera, forcing vines to dig meters down for water and giving wines their firm spine and natural austerity. In understanding the broader context, it is worth noting that unlike many of Portugal's dramatic uplifts, Sintra's wasn't a Pangea-era event; it was tied to the later opening of the North Atlantic and the Iberian Plate hinged on its eastern end, pivoted counterclockwise away from what is today the French Atlantic seaboard: a tectonic shuffle that opened the Bay of Biscay. Beneath lies the Lusitanian Basin's marine limestones and marls, dense with fossils, while the nearby Serra de Sintra rises as the eroded heart of a Late Cretaceous intrusion of syenite, granite, and gabbro-diorite, baked and tilted by tectonic upheaval. Each layer registers in the wines: the firmness of limestone, the cool delicacy of sand, the mineral depth of clay. San Michel farms 7.2 hectares split between Janas's limestone parcels and Colares's sand, practicing organic farming with cover crops, copper and sulfur reduced to under two kilos a year, and densities of 5,000 vines per hectare in limestone and 3,000 in sand.



In 2010, at nineteen, Alexandre (Alex) Guedes stumbled into a harvest job in the Douro while still a Civil Engineering student, expecting to pick grapes but ending up in the cellar. That chance encounter led him to abandon engineering, study agronomy and viticulture, and eventually work in cellars from Portugal to Tuscany, Marlborough, Oregon, and Clare Valley. He joined Joaquim Camillo at San Michel, where his first solo release, a 2017 Arinto, was named one of Portugal's Top 10 Wines. Since then, Alex has married Joaquim's daughter Inês, nearly finished his Master of Wine, and guided San Michel into one of the country's most promising projects. He calls himself a taste-driven winemaker, using chemistry only for confirmation, not alteration, aiming for wines of consistency, refreshment, and place. With Rodrigo Martins advising vineyard management, San Michel is moving toward organics and eventually biodynamics, though mildew remains their constant antagonist. Alex's inspiration comes from Joaquim, "with the vigor of a man half his age," whose vision still drives the estate forward.





FIVE WINES

San Michel's Janas range reflects limestone muscle and salty freshness, with **MALVARINTO DE JANAS** (a marriage of Malvasia de Colares and Arinto) showing textured power shaped by lees and French oak. **MALVASIA DE JANAS**, from a 0.6-hectare plot, expresses saline depth, spice, and soft fruit aromatics with a glycerol touch, while **CURTIMENTA** from the same parcel takes a wilder route, spending fifteen days on skins before a year in French and Hungarian oak for a deeper, more tactile structure. **ARINTO DE JANAS**, also from a 0.6-hectare site, is aged twelve months on lees in middle-aged French oak, balancing its broad frame with subtle roundness. **GALEGO DOURADO**, planted in 2020, is direct-pressed and briefly aged on lees in older oak, capturing freshness with quiet layering. Together these wines, along with tiny-production sparkling not exported, are joined by the estate's future Colares DOC wines: Malvasia de Colares and ungrafted Ramisco from sand, whose first own-rooted harvest will come in 2025, with U.S. arrivals projected for 2028–29.

MENINA D'UVA
TRÁS-OS-MONTES
(AVAILABLE FROM THE SOURCE IN ALL U.S. MARKETS)



Born in Paris in 1989 to Portuguese immigrants, Aline Domingues returned to her family's remote village of Uva in Trás-os-Montes in 2017 after completing three master's degrees, including Biology and Fermentation Science. She began revitalizing three old-vine plots and now works exclusively with indigenous varieties, organically farmed on schist and gneiss with sand, gravel, and clay at about 550 meters altitude. Despite the pandemic, she moved forward with her partner Emanuel, built a new winery, and had a baby, leaving behind the two tiny tombs she once worked in. Uva, in the eastern Planalto Mirandês, is a stark and desolate countryside long known for rustic, high-alcohol wines, but Aline's stand in contrast: light in hue, low to medium in alcohol, fresh, aromatic, and mineral. Her **2023 BRANCO** (formerly Liquen) is 70% Malvasia with Bastardo Branco, Formosa, and Poilta, deeply textured and aged eight months in steel. The **2023 CISTE**, from over fifteen co-fermented indigenous grapes, is perhaps her most beguiling, while the **2023 PALOMBA**, 90% Tinta Gorda with a long maceration, shows the deepest expression and was the wine that first moved us to action. Finally, the **2023 URÇ**, a centenarian field blend grown at 750 meters on granite sand, ferments in concrete and charms with lift and grounding.

FABIO ZAMBOLIN
ALTO PIEMONTE
(AVAILABLE FROM THE SOURCE IN ALL U.S. MARKETS)



Fabio Zambolin continues to raise his own bar every year, and our visits last November and again this July confirmed it. In the solemn world of Alto Piemonte reds, it was unexpected that Fabio's blend, the **2022 COSTE DELLE SESIA 'FELDO,'** would beat out nearly all Piemonte wines tasted on that July trip, with its tightly wound yet bombastic blend of half Nebbiolo and equal parts Croatina and Vespolina from vines his grandfather Felto planted in 1953. This is one of those wines that might make one believe in Dionisis, with Nebbiolo keeping the noble court focused and Felto impossible to ignore. Fabio's **2022 COSTE DELLE SESIA NEBBIOLO 'VALLELONGA'** doesn't have quite the same turn-key pleasure, but compared to past vintages it is still a pleasure bomb,

unfolding from a tannic, tight start into flowers and stone fruit tension after thirty minutes in the glass. Felto keeps its constant joyful pace while Vallelonga, pure Nebbiolo grown on volcanic marine sands, shows restraint, finesse, and depth if attention is paid to the details. It is difficult to decide which is the top wine between the two, but both are special and will please almost everyone, even those new to Alto Piemonte. Fabio also made his first orange wine, the **2023 ERBALUCE (VINO BIANCO) 'LA LIDA,'** which could not be passed up for its joy, fun, texture, and aromas tied together.

NEW ARRIVALS

FLETCHER

2022 BARBARESCO

(AVAILABLE FROM THE SOURCE IN ALL U.S. MARKETS, EXCEPT NY/NJ)



Australian enologist Dave Fletcher arrived in Barolo and Barbaresco in 2009 as an intern at Ceretto, later becoming their head red winemaker and now consultant, while building his own cellar rooted in organic farming, patience, and expression over intervention. With Roncaglie temporarily on hold, the 2022 releases include Ronchi and Trepunti alongside Faset and Recta Pete, each showing the brilliance of a vintage where vines shut down in the heat, then reopened with restraint, yielding wines of poise, freshness, and elegance.

Dave describes the 2022s as tighter in tannin, brighter in acidity, and longer than the powerful 2021s, with Faset showing extraordinary elegance, Ronchi debuting as a single-vineyard bottling of restrained power, and Trepunti as the culmination of his massale-selection project in Montestefano, Roncaglie, and Staderi.

The 2022 **BARBARESCO 'RECTA PETE,'** blending Faset, Ca' Grossa, Serragrilli, and Ronchi, is fleshier and more approachable than the single-vineyard crus. **FASET**, from its cooler northern face, offered purity and length Dave doubts will be seen again, while **RONCHI**, an east-facing site shaded in the afternoons, ripened later and with greater balance. **TREPUNTI**, co-fermented and aged for two years in old barrels, comes from three personally planted sites not yet recognized as cru but managed entirely by hand with massale selections from old Barbaresco vineyards. In the cellar, all Nebbiolos are destemmed, fermented with native yeasts, and aged two years in old barrels without fining or filtration, producing in 2022 wines of finesse and length, and in 2023 Nebbiolos with pronounced red fruit aromatics, spice, and fine tannins. Together, Fletcher's range reflects an Australian in Barbaresco with a decade's commitment to detail, terroir, and elegance.

NEW ARRIVALS

CAROLE KOHLER | JARDINS DE FLEURY

THOUARS, LOIRE VALLEY

(AVAILABLE FROM THE SOURCE IN ALL U.S. MARKETS)



Mark these words: Carole Kohler is going to be a “thing”—from just three hectares of organic and biodynamic vineyards, her inaugural US release of 2022 Chenin Blanc ‘Source’ and Cabernet Franc ‘Jardin’ already turned heads. On the historic 15th-century Fleury estate, Carole, a former chemist, and her husband Brice, revived the site’s forgotten viticultural past, crafting Chenin on schist of the Massif Armorican and Cabernet Franc on Jurassic Toarcian limestone. Source, planted in 2017, is a quartz- and schist-rich Chenin Blanc parcel yielding an explosive, mineral white; the **2023 SOURCE**, picked early at 10.5% alcohol due to botrytis pressure, is finer and more delicate than the 2022 solar-powered version. Nearby Séquoia, planted in 2019, usually more linear and finer than Source, is fuller in 2023, though still distinct in contrast; tasted over five nights, Source gained weight and focus, while the **2023 SÉQUOIA** showed nuance, spice, and lift. Both were whole-cluster pressed, naturally fermented in steel, and aged in amphora and old oak before bottling with minimal sulfites, unfinned and unfiltered. Jardin, Carole’s no-sulfite Cabernet Franc, dazzles in both 2022 and 2023—robust and earthy in 2022, ethereal and lifted in the **2023 JARDIN**—showing wild grit in one season and polish in the next. Grown on Toarcian limestone, Jardin is destemmed, fermented by infusion, and aged in old oak and concrete eggs, its vitality and detail a rare achievement from such young vines.

Vincent Charlot, a man who resembles a blond James Dean with a cigarette hanging from his mouth, is one intense man. Vincent descends from a long lineage of family cooperatives. Passionate and eager to take on the challenge, he bought a press and took over the family business in 2001. With only four total hectares, in six communes with 33 parcels, Charlot has become a master of organic and biodynamic viticulture. To spend the afternoon with Charlot, means you will not only witness his remarkable knowledge of the complex microcosm that are his thriving vineyards, but also you will see the rich biodiversity that populates them, including various species of strawberries and carrots that grow wild, bees pollinating the lavender bushes and mushrooms that sprout between the vines as if to boast its healthy terroir. It is not only a visual experience, but a spiritual one as well.

Catherine and Pascal Mazet established their domaine in 1981 and in 2009 began organically farming their two and a half hectares of premier cru in the Montagne de Reims communes Chigny-les-Roses and Ludes, and the grand cru, Ambonnay. Their son Olivier joined in 2019 and incorporated agroforestry to further improve nature's interaction with their mildly steep hills of chalk, clay and sand. Natural fermentations and sur lie aging take place in old oak barrels over fifteen months. Bottle maturation on lees lasts for a minimum of five years and the dosage is specific for each wine.

The young and idealistic Maxime Ponson's organic wines are unique to his taste and demonstrate his strong belief in Pinot Meunier, the backbone and structure of most of his wines. His preference is for more ripe grapes and is not concerned about potential acidity losses in warmer years because the wines have other components that bring balance. He and his younger brother, Camille, work their family's vineyards in La Petite Montagne, a sub-section of Champagne's Montagne de Reims, located west of Reims. La Petite Montagne is home to some regional luminaries and top talents. He explained, "I'm sure that I don't produce the best wine in the world. But I produce my wine, and they have my identity and the identity of my terroirs."

Eric Collinet moved to Bragelogne-Beauvoir in 1987 from Limousin, a cow town famous for a breed of cattle with the same name. Twenty minutes by car from the center of Les Riceys, one of Champagne's southernmost regions on the Côte des Bar, famous for its Pinot Noir bubbles and unique appellation still rosé, Rosé des Riceys, he has 2.25 hectares of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay and land for truffles. Agroforestry, organic (certified), and biodynamic practices underpin "all of my actions: the respect of the seasons, nature and its rhythm; to listen to nature quietly and with patience to look at it and accompany it."

Elise Dechannes runs a petite domaine under biodynamic culture in Les Riceys, two hamlets (Ricey-Bas and Ricey-Haut) that share a small appellation in the south of Champagne known for its rosé, Rosé des Riceys, just an hour drive northeast of Chablis. The character of the Pinot Noir in this region is exceptional and unique. Through her range (almost entirely composed of Pinot Noir based Champagnes and one still wine rosé) the through line of deep but elegant sappiness in the palate and ethereal, wildly complex aromas seem to truly come from this particular place. All of her Champagnes have no dosage. Her Rosé des Riceys is a well-worth-it, juicy and tremendously complex and delicious rosé with real stuffing; it alone brings greater meaning to rosé. Champagne Essentielle is made entirely from Pinot Noir from Les Riceys and her Champagne Chardonnay Brut Nature is a great view into her more distinguished wines.

Established in Champagne in 1837, the de Taisne family decided to bottle their own wines in 2014. Located in Champagne's most southerly region, the Aube's Les Riceys, known as the Barséquanais, is just on the border of the Côte d'Or. Pinot Noir is the focus (as well as a little Chardonnay); it's grown on rocky calcareous clay and silt topsoil, on a bedrock of Jurassic limestone marl and calcareous mudstones with a more blocky geometric shape than Chablis' flaky, friable, fossil-rich Kimmeridgian limestone marls. All wines are hand-harvested and fermented in 25hl-200hl steel vats for 10-15 days with the assistance of neutral Champagne yeasts when needed, and they undergo complete malolactic fermentation. Sulfites are added during pressing, at the end of malolactic, and again at disgorgement, with a Total SO₂ of 40-60 mg/L. The wines are then filtered before aging in bottle.

Since their debut vintage in 2012, they have been laser-focused on a more homeopathic approach, not only in the vineyards, but in the cellar too. Upon the acquisition of their first vineyard, a 0.4 ha parcel on the Côteau du Barzy, Stéphanie and Julien immediately began the conversion to biodynamic practices, and to the naked eye it's evident their land is happy and thriving. The cover crop is verdant with an array of wild thyme, carrots, tomatoes, fruit trees and all things life.

After six years of enology school in Nantes, the humble Alexandre Déramé took over his family estate winery. Although his total production is medium-sized, his yields are among the lowest in Muscadet; his Vieille Vignes bottle quantities are minuscule. Organic conversion began in 2023 with the objective of having the entirety certified within five years. Morandière is a tiny commune in gently rolling hills in Mouzillon, one of the most highly regarded wine villages in Muscadet. Mouzillon is distinctive for its soils high in concentration of gabbro (a metallic-flecked, pale green and black, hard igneous rock developed through slow cooling of basaltic magma) with loamy soil of orange-colored silex and quartz-like rocks. This unique rock imparts the wines with tremendous power and tension.

Forteresse de Berrye's expressive and terroir-focused wines are crafted in a simple and direct way. Its new owners, Gilles, an agronomist and agricultural engineer (among the many métiers of his diverse professional life), and his wife, Sandra, have eliminated the use of all chemical applications in 2019 and began organic culture in 2021; they expect certification by 2024. They began to replace the missing pieds (vine stocks) with high-quality oriented biotypes and planted six hectares of trees on the 26-hectare property (12.5ha of vines) to improve the overall biodiversity of the landscape in support of the forest-capped hill. For them, agroforestry is crucial for repairing the land, though luckily for them (and us), the property's many parcels were well-tended and not destroyed by excessive use of synthetic products prior to their arrival. Gilles says that the land was in quite good shape overall due to the few annual treatments in this low precipitation and low humidity area of Saumur, perhaps one of the driest areas of the Loire Valley overall due to the rain shadow of the Armorican Massif to the west. Many of the old Chenin Blanc bottles left behind in the deeply quarried tuffeau limestone caves by its former owner drink well, with only the quality of the cork being the determining factor.


The rise of Arnaud Lambert is no surprise. Since our wines from the 2010 vintage, his potential was obvious – not only with what skills he already possessed, but how clear it was that he would sharpen them and grow into the spectacular talent he has become. What's most incredible about Arnaud is his ability to churn out such quality with nearly twenty different cuvées rendered from more than forty hectares of vineyards. His wines are spectacularly etched jewels, short on pretension and confection, and long on harmonious depth and purity. Everything from his entry-level reds and whites is astounding within its price range, and the upper class of the range developed for more time in the cellar are striking and warrant exploration for any serious Loire Valley wine enthusiast. Domaine Arnaud Lambert, a relatively new name, was established through the merger of two labels in 2017: Domaine de Saint-Just and Château de Brézé.

VINEYARD QUICKIE: DRY FARMING

Dry farming is a technique that eschews supplemental irrigation—relying completely on the rainfall (and subterranean water) on a given plot. Drip irrigation as we know it was invented and developed in Israel in the 1960s to farm crops in desert climates with limited access to irrigation water and it's an efficient way to increase vineyard yields. While irrigation is not permitted in many European wine regions to maintain a certain elevated quality, climate change will force some to reconsider.

To keep things simple, dry farming has several potential quality advantages over drip irrigation. For one thing, dry-farmed vineyards tend to have deeper root systems because roots grow to where the water flows, which makes the vines work hard for their water. If doing so is their only option for survival, they're gonna keep moving downward! Of course, soil texture is a major factor: sandy and rocky soils have a harder time retaining water than those rich in clay that naturally hold onto it. Also, bedrock types have different water retention capacities. Depending on the source bedrock, the derived soil will tend to have various textures and compositions that might enhance water retention, for instance, a bedrock of compact limestones that can play a role as a water reservoir and improve the upward movement of water. Another aspect to consider is soil depth which can prevent too much saturation during heavy rainfalls while acting as a water reservoir during periods of drought.



Drip-irrigated vines tend to have clustered root systems at the surface because the water supply is located there. Frequent shallow irrigation in one particular spot will keep roots from exploring deeper into the soil, picking up interesting nutrients along the way that have the potential to increase the complexity of the grapes it produces.

The soil near the surface tends to be the highest in organic matter and most fertile. When coupled with plentiful water, it stands to reason that the complexity of the fruit is more likely to be diluted, which leads to diminished structure for the wines. Dry-farmed vines with developed root systems have the advantage of not needing to rely on an external water source and can access a deep supply that renders big heat waves at the surface less dramatic in their effects. However, extreme drought conditions continue to challenge dry-farmed vineyards. In California, this translates to the vines being slower to metabolize their malic acid, which slows ripening, and improves acid retention with less sugar development, resulting in riper grapes!

Irrigation (especially late in the season) promotes more vegetative growth via the hormone auxin, which tricks the vines into continued growth and development of more sugar at the expense of ripening the seeds. Dry farming promotes the healthy development of all plant hormone cycles throughout the year. It can also yield more concentrated flavors, gearing a wine toward quality over quantity. While it saves an enormous expense on vineyards and can potentially make better wine, it can also be riskier for growers in drought-prone areas, making it a challenging decision for many growers.

Third-generation winegrower Fabrice Esnault has more than 20 hectares in Saumur-Champigny's municipalities of Montsoreau and Turquant, and Saumur's most famous commune, Brézé. Devoid of all herbicides and pesticides and sustainably farmed, the vines average 35 years old, the oldest being about 75. The focus is on Chenin Blanc and Cabernet Franc, though he also grows Chardonnay, Grolleau Gris, and Grolleau Noir. Brézé vineyards are tuffeau limestone, clay and sand, and Saumur-Champigny has deeper clay top soils on tuffeau bedrock. Selected local yeasts are employed when needed, and the whites are fermented and aged in fiberglass and old oak barrels without malolactic fermentation, filtered before bottling, and sometimes fined. Saumur-Champignys ferment for three weeks in fiberglass with gentle extractions at low temps (~20°C), followed by eight months in old barrels with light filtration or fining, if needed.

With his concession to nature and commitment to honor the season, sans maquillage, sin compromise, he sets his wines on a direct course, showcasing each season's gifts and challenges, allowing his wines to freely express the mark of their birth year. Warm vintages (like 2020) taste of a season's richer fruits and softer palate while still being delicate and complex. Cold years (like 2021) are brighter, fresher, more tense and rapier-sharp with a gentle and welcome stab.

Meeting François for the first time reveals an intense but shy vigneron. Once asked a question about his wines, his bright blue laser eyes dig in and his mouth moves a mile a minute. François graduated from the famous enology school in Beaune, France. After school, he cut his teeth by working at Domaine Bruno Clair. François took over his father's winery not too long ago and has been turning heads everywhere, first in France and now here. He is one of the first to pick in Sancerre so the acidity of his wines rage, without the green notes. The Sancerre region sits on top of a series of hills and small valleys that were once under the ocean. The ocean deposited all sorts of calcium rich shells from ancient sea-life. In the case of Sancerre, the rock and soil is a mixture of limestone marl, chalk, flint and variations of light to heavy clay, giving a broad range of style amongst the appellation.

The renowned Pouilly-Fumé estate, Château de Tracy, is one of France's most historic and has been owned by the same family for more than six hundred years. The estate vineyards were replanted in the 1950s with massal selections from their vineyards suggested by Maxime Bourret, the château's wine director, to be the oldest DNA of Sauvignon Blanc known in the Loire Valley. The culture in the vineyards is done with organic methods and treatments without certification due to disagreements concerning the overall lack of thorough examination by the governing bodies who confer these credentials. Work in the cellar is done with the intention to highlight their clay-rich, kimmeridgian marl and silex bedrock terroirs. The first Pouilly-Fumé in the range, "Mademoiselle T," is made in a more fruity fashion, while the "Château de Tracy" is more serious and maintains a greater depth of complexity. The "Haute-Densité" is from a kimmeridgian marl and clay vineyard with 17,000 vines per hectare (it's now illegal to plant so many vines per hectare), and it's a wine of magnitude and core strength. The recent addition of Tracy & Cie wines to their range is worthy of exploration from this singular estate also on kimmeridgian marl bedrock and clay topsoil.

At age twenty-one, Romain Collet took over the entire estate and began to make decisions in the cellar. His father, Gilles, was forced into early retirement due to nerve damage in his leg and back. Immediately upon taking the reins, Romain began to experiment with organic and biodynamic farming as well as using natural yeasts. His relentless desire for improvement powers the future of Collet, which continues to inch closer with each vintage toward the elite of Chablis. The Collet style finds themselves right in the middle of two schools of thought regarding Chablis. One advocates for stainless steel tank aging out of the belief that the purity of terroir is best expressed unadulterated by oak, and the other is based around the needs of oak to soften its taut acidic structure and to sculpt wines that are grown in deeper clay soils. The Collets compromise by using older wood barrels in their higher end wines grown on richer soils and stainless steel with their most mineral and precise wines.

The winemaking choices certainly influence the impression of the wine but they never really lose that unmistakable Chablisienne character imprinted by its special limestone soils, the Chardonnay grape and tense acidity that is encouraged by a cool continental climate.

Once in a great while you stumble on a hidden gem, even one that has been in plain sight for decades. My first meeting with Thierry was one of my most eye-opening experiences. He is gentle, thin and soft-spoken with amazingly powerful hands that look like they could crush you with very little effort. This gorgeous village of Irancy is tucked in at the bottom of a very small amphitheater about 20 minutes from the center of Chablis. It shares the same basic geology as Chablis: Portlandian limestone on the upper sections and Kimmerigeian limestone inside of the sloped areas. Irancy is a special climate for Pinot Noir because of its horseshoe shaped amphitheater that faces south, west and north and holds in enough heat to just barely do the job.

GEOLOGY QUICKIE: CHABLIS

KIMMERIDGIAN LIMESTONE MARLS & PORTLANDIAN LIMESTONE

Kimmeridgian and Portlandian geology are side-by-side in several of France's winegrowing zones, sharing time and place, yet their influence on the vine diverges. Though Kimmeridgian strata are slightly older, both were formed in the Late Jurassic, around 150 million years ago. Kimmeridgian is a marl rich in fossilized marine life (especially *Exogyra virgula*), composed of limestone and clay. It's friable, water-retentive, and mineral-balanced—an ideal matrix where vines can thrive. By contrast, Portlandian is a purer, harder limestone (over 95 percent calcium carbonate), with little clay and sparse fossil content. These distinctions may seem subtle, but are anything but for the vine.

Both formations appear together in some of France's most emblematic wine regions, most notably Chablis and the southern end of Champagne, in the Côte des Bar (or Aube). The classical vineyards in Chablis are rooted in Kimmeridgian bedrock, while the higher slopes of Petit Chablis rest on Portlandian layers that cap the older marls. There's a similar pattern in the Aube, where celebrated parcels—particularly around Les Riceys, Bar-sur-Seine, and Montgueux—tend to lie over Kimmeridgian marl; the region does not formally classify vineyards by soil type.

These soils matter because of both structure and chemistry. Kimmeridgian's limestone-clay mix balances water retention and drainage, with a friable texture that encourages deep rooting. Its alkaline pH preserves nutrients, and its microbial richness fosters vine health and complexity.

With its dense and calcitic structure, Portlandian limestone retains less water and tends to support shallower roots. Its compact form warms more quickly, often leading to earlier ripening and simpler, fruit-driven wines. While capable of high quality, Portlandian sites rarely match the nuance or longevity of their Kimmeridgian counterparts.

In some parcels, especially older ones, deeply rooted vines may access fractured Kimmeridgian marl beneath a surface layer of Portlandian. One walk along the upper Grand Cru slope reveals more Portlandian scree at the surface than Kimmeridgian fragments—but what lies below may still drive the wine. The best growers recognized this long before geologists confirmed it.

While Portlandian vineyards have their place—offering charm, immediacy, and fruit—they rarely speak with the same depth or mineral resonance. For those who seek longevity and transparency of site, Kimmeridgian remains the ground most worth walking.

Much like his brisk improvement in David's English, the quality and integrity of his wines and vineyards have advanced at a rapid pace since he took over in 1991, while still attending winemaking school. In 1999 he abandoned conventional farming and by 2006 was completely organic. An overhaul of his vineyard protocol was a dramatic step that allowed an evolution in his winemaking style, which has become more sensitive, more precise, in an attempt to articulate a more intimate engagement with his terroir. Over the last five vintages or so, he extracts less, uses less oak and has increased his percentage of whole cluster fermentations. These changes and the beauty of the plots he purchased from Jacky Truchot (now-retired, but in his day a vigneron with terrific collection of very old vineyards and a cult following of Burgundy lovers), David's wines are turning the heads of both his colleagues in Burgundy and wine lovers around the world.

It, like the other crus of Beaujolais, is scrunched up in the north half of Beaujolais and are dominated by more complex soils: schist and granite. At Jean-Louis' Fleurie vines, the soil is granite; the exception being the Brouilly, which is on limestone. All vineyards are farmed naturally with EU organic certification.

Anthony Thevenet is a young vigneron with the fortune of playing with vines in Morgon that were planted as far back as the American Civil War, yes, 150-year-old vines. As he slowly builds up his production from his family's estate he spends his days working in the cellar of Jean-Marc Foillard, a job that followed an apprenticeship with another reputable producer, Georges Descombes. He works similarly in the vineyards like his teachers, without herbicides or pesticides, and works the soil around his vines by hand. He follows the principles of the natural wine movement but the wines remain strikingly clear from many flaws that adorn wines in this movement. The sandy and rocky soils, known as rotton rocks, of Morgon provide a certain structure and richness that is rarely matched by other crus. The famous hill of Cote du Py has a unique soil type that is mostly composed of schist, blue granite and volcanic rock produces the most powerful examples of Beaujolais. Morgon may be the Beaujolais' quintessential village.

LAB QUICKIE: COPPER SULFATE

Copper sulfate is not as common of a vineyard treatment in the US and most of the New World. Yet in Europe, it remains one of the most common fungicides for organic and biodynamic viticulture, though alternative treatments are being explored. It's applied during the vegetative growth cycle in rainy periods to combat downy mildew, a fungus that, like the global problem of powdery mildew, feasts on the plant's chlorophyll. Downy mildew is transported by water, making it somewhat predictable but powdery mildew is a sneakier variant; its spores travel through the air and don't need water to germinate, often requiring methodical sulfur spraying before symptoms even appear.

Our French PhD Enologist friend, Manu Gagnepain, says that he notices that more copper treatments result in grape skins becoming denser and harder, which gives them the desired protection against fungal diseases, such as botrytis. But if the treatment is applied late, it can make a wine's tannins drier while leaving a metallic sensation in the mouth. He adds that sometimes large producers make an unnecessary final copper treatment before harvest to give their grapes the impression of more complexity through more noticeable tannins and metallic sensations.



Still in the wines? Manu mentioned that if vines are sprayed less than three weeks before harvest there will likely be residual copper. It can also be easily identified early on by tasting the berries, which will have too much of a metallic sensation. Iron tanks with some kind of copper alloy in the door parts are still relatively common and leave a metallic residue, as can copper sulfate additions to wine in an attempt to resolve reductive elements. If residual copper exists in wines before bottling, it can be reduced using specific fining agents, including the natural clay called bentonite.

There's always a viticultural downside to copper; it sticks around and impairs root development while toxifying the soil for local flora and fauna. Next to herbicides, it's one of the most significant contributors to stunted root systems—these components of the plant that absorb most of the nutrients are fragile and thus the most impacted.

Thankfully, copper alternatives for mildew protection are being explored. Basic things like spraying bentonite clay directly on the leaves have positive results. Alternatives like essential oils and plant extracts from yucca, algae, sage, valerian, yarrow, beneficial fungus (*Trichoderma*), etc, show promise but their effectiveness remains inconsistent in high-disease-pressure conditions, particularly in very wet years when unfortunately, the success rate is often still low.

With their first harvest in 1973 on a small plot in L'Étoile, Anne-Marie Bougaud and Guy Cartaux acquired the Château de Quintigny in 1983, expanding their vineyards and fully committing to winegrowing. Their children, Nathalie and Sébastien Cartaux, took over in 1993, and today Sébastien continues to run the 20-hectare estate, which became organic certified in 2023. The estate produces Chardonnay and Savagnin from AOC L'Étoile, as well as reds (Poulsard, Trousseau, and Pinot Noir) from the Côtes du Jura. The wines are crafted in numerous cellars, including the ancient Château de Quintigny, using both traditional "ouillage" methods (with and without air space in the barrel) and the region's unique oxidative aging process, essential for producing the renowned Vin Jaune. Their objective with reds is to preserve the naturally fresh and bright fruit-led aromatics over rusticity, while their whites a core of acidity and structure led by the aromas, flavors and textures from the ancient noble practice of sous voile aging.

Stephane Rousset's underground status as one of the best producers in the Northern Rhône Valley is about to end. It wasn't too long ago, in what we like to call the age of extraction, that producers making elegant wines were lost in the shuffle. One of the most diverse appellations in France's Northern Rhône Valley, Crozes-Hermitage is also its biggest. Rousset's vineyards lie in its most northern communes of Erôme, Gervans, and Crozes-Hermitage (the village the appellation takes its name from). The soil types here differ greatly from the rest of the appellation. Here you find vines on steep granite terraces of the river's left bank, above the Rhône and tucked back behind the behemoth hill of Hermitage. Across the river, in Tournon, Rousset's two parcels of St. Joseph are on pure granitic soils. In our humble opinion, in this appellation few, if any, vigneron produce wines above this in class and elegance.

Simon, their young son, is already being groomed to start the process of taking the reigns from his pioneering parents. It's no surprise here, just like in any serious estate, that Eric and Sophie stress the importance of their vineyards over all else. The domaine is consciously run without pesticides, chemical fertilizers or herbicides. Since their beginning they have utilized organic methods and are now certified. The wines are a perfect balance of rusticity with precision winemaking.

If Olivier Tropet had vineyards in appellations like Côte Rôtie, Cornas or Châteauneuf-du-Pape he'd be more likely to garner wide acclaim. It's hard to believe what he achieves within the relatively unknown village of Roaix. His range of organically made wines (certified since 2009) are as soulful as they are exquisitely crafted. The reds are savory, deeply flavored, trim and laced with a surprising amount of subtleties for the power they possess. Roaix sits in France's Southern Rhône Valley on the northeast side of the appellation just to the east and north of Rasteau and to the north of Gigondas, which sits just across the Ouvèze Valley. While it shares the same basic grape varieties as its better-known neighbors, there are a number of important distinctions between other appellations in this area and Roaix that make this tiny Côtes du Rhône village an interesting prospect for those who want less boozy southern French wines that still taste of their place.

Cautiously walking the natural wine line, his pursuit is of the clean yet uninhibited, void of unwanted animal smells (the mouse, the horse), but with wonderful character-filled and potently nuanced, high-energy wines filled with joy and authenticity, just like the man himself.

In the cellar, Jean-Marc combines tradition and innovation using old barriques, large Stockinger foudres, Tava amphoras, and amphora eggs.

These low yielding reds (often between 1.5-2 tons per acre) are transparent in hue but maintain a full range of unique and compelling flavors replete with an unmistakable Mediterranean island character. It's no surprise that Laurent is ex-military; he's fully engaged, serious, intimidatingly intense and equally hospitable. When not standing still, he moves with urgency and gives off the impression that he hasn't a second to spare, which is likely true. He does all the vineyard work by himself on all ten of his hectares. It's hard to believe he runs everything alone because that's a tremendous amount of land to cover for one person. However, he moves fast and powerfully, and if anyone could accomplish this feat and make wines of such grace and power, it's clearly him.

Their mere three hectares of vineyards are all planted on hillsides of porphyry, an igneous volcanic rock with a mix of large and small grain sizes, which makes for sandy, gravelly soils as it decomposes, and results in wines with higher aromas and chewy textures. Martin's style is one of pleasure led by upfront aromatic red fruits and red/orange flowers with sharper lines, deep but gentle mineral textures and a soft touch on extraction.

Falkenstein is an Italian cantina with Austrian heritage, both in familial history and the greater influences on their wine style. Located in Italy's Südtirol/Alto Adige, they produce many different wines (Weissburgunder, Sauvignon, Pinot Noir - all grapes that have been cultivated here for centuries), and many consider the Pratzner family the most compelling Riesling producer in Italy. The vineyard and winery are in one of the many glacial valleys in the north of Italy's alpine country, with a typical relief of a flat valley floor surrounded by gorgeous, steep mountains, which creates starkly contrasting shades and colors throughout. All the vineyards in these parts must have the correct exposure on northern positions that provide some angle of a south face, otherwise there is no chance of achieving palatable ripeness. The vineyards here are some of the world's most stunning, and it's surprising how many are tucked into the valleys of Trentino (the bordering region to the south) and the Südtirol.

Enrico Togni-Rebaioli quit his university studies in Law to get out into nature as he returned to his home in Lombardia's Val Camonica, a long valley carved out by glaciers. His organically farmed and nature-packed vineyards sit on limestone terraces only a half kilometer from volcanic hills across the glacial valley. The grapes of his focus are Barbera, which he makes mostly into sparkling wines, a Nebbiolo still wine, and a few different wines from Erbanno, a member of the "Lambrusco" family that requires almost no treatments in the vineyards because of its strong immunity to mildew and disease. One of the Erbanno wines has almost no extraction and is pressed very early and presents itself somewhat like a Premetta, a very light Schiava, Pousard, or even the Galician variety, Brancellao. The other Erbanno is a darker and more extracted version with gamier characteristics that go well with food. His Nebbiolo wine, labeled as Vino Rosso 1703, usually comes in around 12% alcohol and is very light in color and layered with extremely delicate classic varietal nuances.

The realization of Michelangelo Ioppa's dream started in 1852 with the purchase some of the most prized vineyard parcels in Northern Piedmont, in what is today's DOCG, Ghemme. The new generation at Ioppa has their sights set on the past glories of traditionally crafted wines from this region, rebounding from more than a decade of experimentation with 225 liter oak barrels. They've returned to soft extractions and long aging in large, old foudre, and the top four reds in the range are aged in 30-35hl foudre for four years! The majority of the most important Alta Piemonte wine regions are set upon igneous rocks in geological origin, while Ghemme is mostly alluvium. Not all alluvium is the same, and Ghemme's unusual bedrock mostly consists of incredibly friable granite rocks; or what appears to be a rock, but can easily be crushed into sand with a gentle squeeze of your fingertips. The Ioppas have also begun the process of converting to organic farming in 2014.

A true northern Piemonte garagiste, Fabio Zambolin inherited his grandparent's tiny vineyard parcels and converted their garage into a winery. He began his project in 2010 with a parcel that he works organically and that sits within the DOC appellation, Lessona. However, the cantina is ten meters outside of the DOC zone (right next to the vineyards) and an archaic law makes it so that he must label his wines Costa della Sesia, a generic term for regional Northern Piedmont wines. As one could imagine, with such a small quantity of grapes to make his wines the level of detail in his organically farmed vineyard and cellar are maintained to an extraordinary level. Famous Italian wine writers of the late 1800s and early 1900s considered Lessona wines the greatest reds in all of Italy, and in the right hands it can represent one of the most pure expressions of Nebbiolo. Fabio's Vallelonga is made purely of Nebbiolo, and Feldo, a blend of 50% Nebbiolo with equal parts of Croatina and Vespolina the difference.

Immediately, a full conversion to organic farming began, followed by biodynamic starting in 2020 - the latter, a vineyard culture still considered somewhat radical in these parts. The wines are crafted and full of vibrant energy with only a soft polish, with the focus, the slightly turbid and lightly colored, juicy fruity, minerally Grignolino and their two serious but friendly Barberas. Sette's game-changing progressive approach and delicious wines (with total eye candy labels) should ripple through this historic backcountry and bring greater courage to the younger generations to break out of the constraints of the past and move full throttle into the future.

The organically farmed Agricola Brandini is run by two young and idealistic sisters, Serena and Giovanna in full directional control with the support of their father, Piero Bagnasco. Certified organic since 2011, they have also introduced biodynamics and permaculture to their 25 estate-owned hectares in the high-altitude zones of La Morra, Roero and Alta Langa. Their estate Barolo vineyards (four La Morra parcels and R56) are located on the backside (northwest) of La Morra and are characterized by calcareous sandstones that render Barolos of great elegance. They also rent 10 hectares of vines for the crus, Cerretta and Annunziata, and organically farmed and certified, high altitude sites south of Monforte d'Alba for their Alba wines of Dolcetto, Barbera, and Nebbiolo. Vinification for their raw yet refined, pale colored, understated and elegant Nebbiolo are deeper in terroir imprint and structure than those prior to the sisters' takeover in 2015. Brandini's cellar work is progressive (including shorter maceration times, stem inclusion and infusion extraction methods), and it accentuates finesse above all for these botti-aged Barolos that drink well young and also age nicely, building on their youthful assets.

They turned their attention to soil health and the incorporation of organic farming. The cellar work was gentler, and new techniques were employed. They harvest earlier, consider whole cluster and submerged cap fermentations when traditional methods need a boost. They gently extract and press, manipulate less and age in concrete and medium-sized botte. They also bottle early to keep the wines fresh, clean, and not overworked or exhausted before bottling. Led by their three MGA sites, Ravera, Terlo, and La Volta, Nebbiolo is the focus, but Daniele's Barbera, Dolcetto and Nas-cèta also inspire.

In fact, it wouldn't be a stretch if thought to have been crafted by a seventy-something winegrower in the twilight of their career, with an interpretation learned from decades of noise and experimentation, evolving into beauty, balance and a timeless, gentle melody. Dave's philosophy and practice with Nebbiolo is to simply have as little impact as possible and to demonstrate a full display of the talent in each vineyard by focusing on clarity and grace while building on the unmistakable nuances unique to Piemonte. His Barbera, however, is a contemporary of modern, natural Beaujolais wine made with more than a third of its whole clusters and with very little extraction semi-carbonic fermentation – a delicious and thoughtful use of this high acid grape that could use a different face or at least a makeover, on occasion.

A duality within her range plays out in contrasting styles, where Ceregio and Poggio Vicchio delicately balance charm and seriousness, and her wines, like Pietramora, are classically framed with firmer tannins and measured poise. And there's her precious Albana, a variety she is most known for in Italy. A parallel talent to Riesling and Chenin Blanc in versatility, her dry and racy Bianco di Ceparano, and the sticky sweet, botrytised Romagna Albana Passitos are all tightened by high natural tension and with generous and inviting Adriatic salinity.

Sorgente Prosecco comes from a small vineyard plot of only six hectares of Glera vines; there are no other grapes added to the Prosecco and all of them are estate owned. Located in Friuli-Venezia Giulia, the vineyards sit only a few hundred meters from the natural spring (called sorgente in Italian) at the nascita of the Livenza River. The proximity to the Alps (which begins no more than ten miles to the north) and the Adriatic (twenty miles away) brings an ideal temperature characterized by large diurnal swings from day to nighttime which is crucial for the development of complex phenolics, fresh acidity and elevated aromatics - all necessary for a proper Prosecco to remain true to form (bright, fresh, minerally) and function (pleasure over intellect). The vineyard soils are endowed with limestone and clay, both a mixture of the former salty marshland that existed here millions of years ago along with alluvial soils largely composed of limestone. From a pedigree standpoint, there is good reason that one would discover the mineral nuances of this "simple" Prosecco due to its soil composition and climatic balance. There are no herbicides and pesticides used in the vineyards, only vineyard treatments of copper and sulfur. After a rigorous selection process, they sell off more than 60% of their Prosecco base wine to negociants through their leaving a mere 40% off their six estate hectares for these two wines.

Located sixty kilometers from the Adriatic Sea in the Verdicchio di Matelica DOC, Borgo Paglianetto is both in the heart of Italy's Marche as well as in an area most famous for mountain-and-sea influenced, salty, minerally Verdicchio. Inside the unique north-to-south-running, land-locked Alta Valle dell' Esino, Borgo Paglianetto began as a collaboration of five friends in 2008. They have nearly 30 hectares that were planted over twenty years ago (as of 2024), and they've been under organic certification since 2013. The straight-as-an-arrow vine rows face mostly east, peak at 390 meters and gradually flow downhill to 330. The mother rock is Jurassic limestone from the same period as Burgundy's Côte d'Or, and with similarly sticky, thick, grayish-white clay topsoil found in many of Burgundy's best white wine vineyards. The results across the range are impressive, but none more than in the value delivered by the two entry-level Verdicchios: Terravignata and Petrarà.

His mission was to bring back the spirit of these historic Chianti Classico wines that began with the 1973 vintage made by Dunkley and his then enologist, Carlo Ferrini. Ferrini has since become one of the biggest names in Italian wine and Alessandro's first order of business was to ask him back to help rediscover the magic that he had found there over forty years ago. After Dunkley passed away in 1996, Ferrini decided to move on the following year. He was surprised by the call from Alessandro and hadn't been back to Riecine since the day he resigned. "It had been almost twenty years and when Ferrini arrived, he had tears in his eyes. John and Palmina were like Ferrini's second parents. It was a great moment to have him back," Alessandro explained.

There is no better environment for an artistic, free-thinking, well-trained and technically astute enologist and vignaiolo than the countryside where Giacomo Baraldo started his Tuscan wine adventure in his hometown of San Casciano dei Bagni, the small, gorgeous and historic Tuscan village famous for its thermal baths along with some recently discovered ancient artifacts that are rewriting history. Influenced by his past, supported by his family, yet beholden to nothing and no one, he thinks freely and acts on intuition guided by his near decade of widely varied experiences in wineries from Bordeaux and Burgundy, to Patagonia and New Zealand (where he also has a small ongoing wine project). In his early thirties, he settled back home in San Casciano dei Bagni to craft wine on unknown, high-altitude terroirs. His wines are thoughtful, exploratory, generous-but-measured and diverse, from Chardonnay planted on a rocky limestone slope below cliffs using massale selections from the Côte d'Or gathered from friendly vigneroni he met in his years working and training in Burgundy. His Grechetto orange wine was reborn in the field from vines below the main square of San Casciano dei Bagni, and his Sangiovese single-site wines must be highlighted, as they are his true muse, the inspiration that guides his work to unlock the potential of Monte Cetona, a solitary limestone mountain with a complex geology halfway between Rome and Florence in the Provincia di Siena. This rugged and strong but intellectually refined statue of a man challenges the belief that Europe's great terroirs are all already documented. Monte Cetona has no known vinous history, though when you taste Giacomo's wines, you can't help but wonder, as he does, how this hill was missed.

CantinArte is the unification of two Abruzzesi families from very different areas inside one of Italy's many extremely geologically and topographically diverse Italian departments. The cantina's range of Abruzzo whites, rosé (Cerasuolo), and reds are extremely diverse and come from opposing terroirs: one by the sea and the other high up in the mountains. Francesca Di Nosio and Diego Gasbarri began their wine adventure together in 2007 with the Montepulciano vineyard (planted in 1970) inside the Province of Chieti at 300m and about ten kilometers from the Adriatic Sea on soft sloping southeast exposed vines grow on deep clay and produce balanced, bright and fresh, red-fruited young wines. By contrast, their tension-filled Pecorino and Pinot Grigio grow in the mountains on limestone bedrock and clay and limestone topsoil at 740m in Diego's familial neighborhood about an hour's drive from the Montepulciano vineyard. All wines are hand harvested, spontaneous fermented and aged in steel, old French oak and amphora.

As a fourth-generation winegrower, Sergio Arcuri grew up making traditional Cirò (a DOC created in 1969 – one of the first in Italy) with his father, “Since he was three,” and from early on knew he wanted to make wine. He bottled his first vintage in 2009, commercialized his first rosato in 2010, and rosso in 2011. Most of the region's vineyards extend from only meters of altitude, and few reach beyond 300-400m. There are areas with higher quantities of calcareous materials than others (like Langhe), with the majority either S/SE/W of the hilltop village, Cirò, and on a flat area around Cirò Marina's beachfront. All six hectares of Arcuri's vineyards are inside the Classico zone on the plain beside the sea, with the highest reaching 70m in altitude. The average vine age is 30 years old, with the oldest parcels being 70. Vinification involves varying lengths of maceration time (three to four hours for “Il Marinetto,” three to four days for “Aris,” nine to 15 days for “Piu Vite”), natural fermentations in tank, with fully submerged caps and no must movements. They are lightly pressed (stronger press juice wines sold to local friends) and aged in concrete (six months for Rosato, 20 months Aris, four years for Piu Vite), and are finished with low sulfite levels after malolactic and again before bottling. The white and Rosato are filtered before bottling, and none are fined.

Their vinification includes natural fermentation and maceration of destemmed grapes for around one week are pressed and they finish fermentation in steel. Purple Barrus is aged exclusively in steel while Orange Barrus, their "selezione" is raised for 12-18 months in old French oak barrels of 225-500l.

During his tenure as the head winemaker for the famous Monção e Melgaço producer, Anselmo Mendes, Constantino's personal wine project started with a challenge from his cousin who had a few small vineyard plots in Monção that were higher in altitude than the typical vineyards in the area. Affluent, his Alvarinho is often one of the first vineyards picked in the entire appellation, leading to wines of high amplitude and vibrant acidity, and his red, Zafirah (a Muslim name that means graciousness), is made of a mix of the high-spirited red grapes, Brancelho, Cainho Longo, Espadeiro, Vinhão and Borraçal (Caíño Tinto).

The strikingly beautiful and serene Quinta do Ameal is in the heart of the Lima Valley, within Portugal's vast Vinho Verde wine region. The Lima Valley is the most northwesterly zone and borders the Atlantic Ocean to the west and is separated from Spain by the Minho River to the north. The altitude of the vineyards inside this east/west valley get higher to further west one goes, and the terrain becomes more uneven, giving rise to multiple micro-climates, with the Lima Valley perhaps the coldest and with the most precipitation. The Loureiro grape (the sole grape used in all of Ameal's wines) thrives in the vineyard's igneous granite bedrock and topsoil - the same bedrock that covers the majority of the valley, with the remainder variations of metamorphic rock. Ameal's wines here are made in neutral vessels (stainless steel for the entry-level wine, old barrels for the higher-end wines) and remain fresh, low in alcohol and extremely versatile with almost any kind of food from land and sea.

Here, she's begun to modernize the wines in the best possible way: indigenous local grape varieties, organic farming, naked wines made through gentle extraction and a low-tech, heavily thought out, soft-touch approach. The result is wines with soft-colored hues, low-to-medium alcohol with natural freshness and tension. Her wines have heightened aromatic nuances of spring fruits, moorland brush and flowers, with unusually profound minerally and metallic textures that vibrate on the palate.

Mateus Nicolau de Almeida and his wife, Teresa Ameztoy, began their organic/biodynamic/natural wine project in 2015. Organically farmed and certified, their wines reflect the attributes of a combination of vineyards in the different subregions of Douro and a multitude of indigenous grape varieties. The Trans Douro Express are three "climate" reds from roughly ten different vineyards that demonstrate what each subregion has to offer: Baixo Corgo in the west is the coldest and wettest, on the far east, on the border of Spain, is Douro Superior, the driest and warmest, while in the center is , a climatic balance of the two extremes. Each of these wines illustrates the differences in climate, which, of course, is determined by the variety of grapes suitable for each area. Eremitas are three white wines from the Douro Superior and express three different schist-based terroirs. Made only in particular years, the Curral Teles their "human wines," are their most experimental, tinkered with in the cellar (including one wine aged inside a granite block!) to discover new gateways to different expressions and nuances. There are also two stellar (but in very low supply), traditionally crafted Port wines, Lágrima (white Port) and Ruby Seco. The wines are often lightly filtered (though the whites that don't go through malolactic are sterile filtered) and they are rarely fined.

Niepoort has a history of recognizing talent and churning out many superstars in Portugal, most notably Luis Seabra, the boys over at Arribas Wine Company (also in our portfolio), and starting in 2018, Luis Jr. The respect he has garnered at a very young age in Portugal speaks volumes for the confidence the local wine world has in his skill and attention to detail. Exciting things are in store for this very small estate with wines that cover both the traditional style like his father's, and the extreme progressivism of his generation, with a gorgeous touch, exquisite crafting and a razor-sharp attention to detail. Expect big things, albeit in very small quantities (unfortunately) from this special Quinta.

After years working alongside some of Portugal's most gifted winemakers and with many New World growers, Alexandre "Alex" Guedes voted in 2025 as one of the country's top five new winegrowers joined Quinta da San Michel in 2018 after his first harvest at the estate, where he unexpectedly met his future bride. Under Alex's steady, inquisitive hand, and guided by the disciplined mind of a winemaker nearing his Master of Wine, Quinta da San Michel is poised to become one of the most promising voices in Portugal's Atlantic wine frontier. Their vineyards span two striking terrains: Janas, between the Sintra Mountains and the Atlantic and new plantings on the legendary sandy soils of Colares – some on the valley floor in meters-deep sands, others above coastal bluffs on calcareous sands and limestone bedrock facing the ocean's salt-rich winds. San Michel is focused on historic local varieties, like Malvasia de Colares, Arinto, and Galego Dourado, and soon joined by the infamous red Ramisco, each deeply tied to this mythical viticultural coastline. Their wines from clay and limestone echo the great vineyards of France's Côte d'Or but carry a maritime salty freshness and stout, architectural structure, while those from sand promise wines of delicate filigree, resurrecting the past glories of Colares where Malvasia and Ramisco have thrived ungrafted for centuries.

Its line of extraordinary successes produced from vines planted in 1901 and 1903 by Senhor Chaves fell off the map when they were sold in the 1990s to a sparkling wine company. The property's fortune changed with its purchase in 2017 by Fundação Eugénio de Almeida under the direction of Pedro Baptista, one of Portugal's most celebrated oenologists most famously known for producing Pera Manca, some of the country's most prized (and expensive) wines. Immediately these historic vineyards planted on a unique granite massif that towers over the flatter lands more typical of Alentejo below were converted to biodynamic farming, priming Tapada do Chaves to reassert itself as one of Portugal's most preeminent terroirs. The white wines are blends of Arinto, Assario, Fernão Pires, Tamarez, and Roupeiro, with the reds Trincadeira, Grand Noir, Aragonez, and Alicante Bouschet.

Xesteiriña is destined to be yet another Salnés Vally Albariño superstar. This singular wine that comes in two forms, with added sulfites and without, comes from a single vineyard just west of Portonovo, two kilometers from the Atlantic. The project and property are owned and operated by the extremely sharp and thoughtful José Manuel Dominguez, an Agricultural Engineer who comes from three generations of winegrowers in Salnés. It's a unique geological location largely composed of granodiorite and what may be some transitional materials similar to gneiss, the extremely spare topsoil is derived from the bedrock though almost entirely composed of organic matter. Surrounded by forests of mostly indigenous Galician trees (rare in these parts overrun by Eucalyptus), approaching the vineyard takes caution and respect for the ecological environment. Organic methods guide his work, despite his being so close to the ocean a hostile environment for mildew and vine diseases.

These ancient plants fill his full-bodied Albariños with structure and a pure citrusy, salty, minerally, high acidity power that only Albariño possesses. He also makes a compelling range of red wines with Mencía and Caíño.

One of the brightest lights in the slowly rising tide of the Rías Baixas, Manuel Moldes has an aptitude for finely tuned, deeply technical wine analysis, but it's his curiosity and open mind that guide him. Manuel's approach to his Albariño range is to have wines with notable differentiating characteristics; they either contrast the soil type altogether, whether it be completely on schist, the A Capela de Aios, or those granite parcels bottled as Afelio; or the particularities within a rock and soil type to illuminate their differences and are compelling enough to be bottled alone, like As Dunas, from sandy schist soil with no bedrock contrasts A Capela de Aios, grown on shallow schist topsoil with a soft schist bedrock. The simplicity of the red winemaking follows suit with the Albariños, but involves the art of blending different grape varieties from numerous terroirs into one wine. Acios Mouro, a blend of 60% Caiño Redondo, 20% Loureiro Tinto, 20% Espadeiro, is an extremely high-toned red from the Rías Bixas, and his Bierzo, a more supple red blended with 60% Garnacha Tintorera and 40% Mencía.



A native of Galicia, Gutier Seijo Otero developed his own project, Mix and Mixtura, in 2019 after nearly a decade at the helm of the historical Ribeira Sacra winery, Dominio do Bibei. Though his winery is in Ribeiro, the project is focused on recovering historical vineyards and native grape varieties in northwestern Spain and Portugal along the Miño and Sil rivers. His wines disregard traditional political boundaries and are labeled without appellation and variety. The project is rooted in a deep respect for the land and culture, using minimal intervention and native yeasts, with Mix largely vinified and aged in small old French oak and Tava amphoras, and Mixtura in concrete eggs and Stockinger barrels.

Iago Garrido may be destined to become one of Spain's most influential winegrowers. In 2014 this former professional soccer player buried an amphora filled with Treixadura in the middle of his granite vineyard inside Ribeiro's Avia River Valley. Initially convinced he had made a mistake with the discovery of a flor yeast veil, he later realized this errant shot actually hit a vein of gold that went on to define the direction of his wines. What makes Iago's wines special is not only that he welcomes the influence of flor yeast, or that he is committed to biodynamic practices in his cellar and the vineyards he owns and the ones he works directly himself, and to only using a minuscule dose of sulfur in his wines, it's his razor-sharp attention to detail coupled with his openness to take in the ideas and opinions of others. His creative range is focused on indigenous Galician varieties with many different bottlings.

Diego and his brother, Álvaro, grew up in Vigo, northwestern Spain's largest metropolitan and industrial area. The bustle of city life wasn't in their blood, so in their early twenties they embarked on the courageous restoration of vineyards with their cousins, Anxo and Fito, in an ancient Galician ruin where their ancestors once lived. They started their new lifelong adventure together in 2005 that ultimately pushed them to the brink of financial ruin and tested their relationships with each other and many of their loved ones. The vineyards are surrounded by dense forest and sit on the top of a hill (a Cume) above the river Avia. By 2008 they planted their first vines, and in 2012 finally made their first vinification "tests," as Diego calls them; it was the first time any of them had ever made wine. On the vineyard are thirteen different indigenous Galician varietals selected from ancient vines in the Ribeiro. "The past of these forgotten grapes has been erased, leaving no one to discuss the ideal practices for them. Much knowledge was discarded with the introduction of chemicals to the vineyards after the second World War and there is no manual or record. We are trying to reinvent and rebuild this lost history," Diego explained. In what they would consider their first real vintage, the 2017 wines are gorgeous and taut with energy. They are not to be missed by those interested in the rise of Galician wines.

He has influenced many fellow winegrowers with his extraordinary, intuitive ability to understand the nature of any particular terroir and maximize its potential. Today, Pablo has dropped his winemaker consulting life to focus on his own projects based in Ribeira Sacra's Ribeiras do Sil subzone with indigenous variety vineyards set at high altitudes in a largely abandoned viticultural area. Everything is done by hand with great care and a gentle approach with natural yeasts, hand harvesting and varying degrees of stem inclusion, gentle extraction (almost infusion), aging in steel or old oak and very little in the way of added sulfites.

Xabi Soeanes is in love with his Galician countryside, and he's even more taken in by its nearly forgotten past. His greatest desire, his dream, is to share this cultural treasure with the world, through the lens of his varietally blended wines - the historical winegrowing practice of this area. Fazenda Prádio (named after a local tree known as a false maple, or sycamore) is located within the Chantada subzone, one of the coldest of Ribeira Sacra, heavily influenced by the Atlantic. His 3.5ha of vines, a collection of Mencía, Caíño Longo, Merenzao, Brancellao, Godello, and other indigenous varieties, are perched on wide terraces between 180-300m that overlook the Miño River gorge and are carved out of a steep hill of granite and schist. Xabi practiced organic and biodynamic farming for years but after a series of seasons that almost put him out of business, he keeps the door open to move freely when needed.

The story of Fuentes del Silencio is of Indiana Jones-level proportions for lost and nearly forgotten wine cultures. Miguel Angel Alonso and his wife Maria José Galera, retired doctors and hobby winemakers, have stumbled on and excavated one of the rarities of the wine world. In the south of Leon province, up on the high plains of Herreros de Jamuz, among forests and fields of shrubs, they discovered the ancient Mencia vineyards buried under grounds that predate the phylloxera epidemic. There they started a rescue mission, restoring many of the old vines and putting them back into production. Miguel and Maria developed a team of passionate wine professionals who seem more like archeologists, and taken on the task of bringing this Spanish treasure trove back to its former glory with a minimalist approach in the cellar. The youngest vines of their collection of parcels were registered as planted in 1930, but the oldest locals told Miguel stories about their grandfathers planting the last set of vines closer to the turn of the century, after phylloxera had passed through. I've seen a lot of unique looking vines, but I've never come across anything that looked like hairy little square animals, dug into the ground, with vine shoots sprouting from their backs.

The wines made in Txakoli by Alfredo Egia are radical for the region but not for the world, since he is fully committed to biodynamic farming and natural wine methods. And with the influence of Imanol Garay, the highly intense and fully committed naturalist from France whom he refers to as his mentor, he's determined to harness the intense energy of Izkiriota Txikia (Petit Manseng) and Hondarrabi Zerratia (Petit Courbu) to give them an altogether different expression, shape and energy, with a constant evolution upon opening that can last for days. These white wines walk the line with no added sulfur and should be consumed earlier in their life to ensure captivity of their best moment. Whether they can age well or not remains to be seen, but since they have very low pH levels that usually sit below 3.20, and ta levels that can be well above 7.00, they should be insulated for a while. Rebel Rebel is the solo project of Alfredo, and Hegan Egin a joint venture between Alfredo, Imanol and e Iturri.

Artuke's Arturo Miguel is a quiet but influential leader of a new movement of young Spanish vignerons in Rioja, the country's most historically famous region. The agenda is to bring attention back to specific terroirs and return the power to the growers themselves. He is the second generation of his family to grow and bottle their own wines since the end of the dictatorship, and when he took control of the family's vineyards, he converted them all to organic farming. His cellar techniques are straightforward, with older barrels of different shapes and sizes that highlight the differences between the four specific vineyard wines, except for the ARTUKE bottling made with carbonic maceration, a long-standing tradition with local wines, and Pies Negros, Spanish for black feet, a reference to the foot-stomping of the grapes, which is a blend of many different parcels. All wines come from calcareous sandstone (similar in structure and mineral makeup to sandstones from Barolo and Barbaresco) with varying degrees of sand and clay.

His experience with architecture leads him down rabbit holes of possibility and experimentation (a rarity in this often predictable and extremely conservative wine region), so that he may better understand the aesthetic of each site and build on its strengths using various fermentation and aging techniques.

The life and authenticity in their first wines (started in 2017) are clear and their future is promising.

Raised by his mother and grandmother, Carmelo inherited from them a big heart, warmth and charm, along with the inner-city energy and hustle of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, an industrial port crunched between the sleeping volcano and Atlantic crammed with half a million locals and four million tourists each year. He returned home in 2017 to begin Bien de Altura after traveling the world working in cellars and vineyards. Listán Negro is the dominant grape in Carmelo's range, and results in more elegant wines with a fresher fruit profile. In this arid climate with an average annual rainfall of only 134 cm (5.3 inches) and at some of the wine world's highest altitudes, from 1,100-1,460 meters (3,600-4,800 feet), on mostly east-facing sites on extremely steep orange volcanic sand, silt, clay, and rocky topsoil, he crafts a series of wines with a global cult following. The cellar practices are intendedly low tech and made with minimal sulfites, whole bunch fermentations, extended macerations and neutral aging vessels.

The problem with Peter's wines is that there is too much to think about when tasting them, and they can be the most sublime and pure expression of any wine created on this planet. Peter Veyder-Malberg, or as I refer to him, Peter Pan, rages with ideology and a child-like enthusiasm for his vineyards. He is well beyond organic or biodynamic production with his thinking and spends his time cultivating positive working relationships with his insects or conversing with mushrooms and microorganisms that live in the root systems of his vines. Peter is a bit of a wizard and seems to have come from nowhere, or maybe, Neverland. In Peter's town in Austria's Wachau wine region, Spitz, Riesling and Gruner Veltliner thrive on the steeply terraced hills along the Danube River bank and principally grow on gneiss and loess soils.

A former truck driver who seemingly explains with pride that he was fired from his job (likely for wanting to do everything with greater precision!), Martin Muthenthaler returned home to his family's vineyards in the Spitzer Graben of the Wachau, the coldest section on the north side (left bank) of the Danube (Donau) River. Once a former pathway of the Danube before tectonic movements altered the course of the river, this steep, east-to-west running valley splits off from the Danube at the far western end of the Wachau where it turns north about 4 km in. Here, Martin farms organically, almost everything of the work himself, at least until the arrival of his Bavarian wife, Melanie, who in 2021 began helping with the vineyard and administration. Without the assistance of outside consultants in the cellar but drawing on many years of exchange and collaboration with his great friend and neighbor, the Wachau luminary Peter Veyder-Malberg, this garagiste renaissance man with a talented green thumb and palate crafts Rieslings and Grüner Veltliners of sterling precision and quality, which have few equals in all of Austria.

Martin Mittelbach is a Wachau insider with an outsider's perspective. Martin took over the estate at a very young age and immediately changed the way things were done. As you could imagine, there was some friction with his father who preferred to make wines more on the sweeter side. Today, you would be hard pressed to find a more dry and straight style in the Wachau. The grapes are harvested and sorted rigorously to take out any botrytis grapes and then vinified and raised in stainless steel. They are harvested with no botrytis to keep the wines focused and tense. His wines are like his personality: intense, focused and highly intellectual. These laser beams are as far away from the often baroque style that can be found in this region. In every level his wines excel and can stand tall next to any of the greatest producers in Austria.



It is never easy to fill the shoes of a powerful and polarizing figure, like Gerald Malat, but Gerald's tall, handsome and forever smiling son, is doing just that. The previous level has been elevating under Michael's eagle-like eyes which have set him on his upward climb. At this estate, even the entry-level wines find absolute deliciousness and express enough intellect to enamor us wine geeks. Kremstal is one of the most recent DAC to be added to Austria. Founded in 2007, just east of the Wachau, this large appellation is divided into three significant zones. The most western part of the valley, near Stein, is primarily rocky soils, ideal for the elegant, yet intense, Riesling. As you move east toward Krems, deep loess soils cover the vineyards allowing Gruner Veltliner to express its highly aromatic and fresh nature. The third zone of the Kremstal is located on the southern banks of the Danube River, where some of the most pleasant wine villages are found.

GEOLOGY QUICKIE: WHAT'S LOESS GOT TO DO WITH IT?

Sing it, Tina! What *is* loess? That off-white, fine-grain soil known as loess finds its way into many wine regions around the Alps. In Western Europe, it's largely a result of Alpine glaciers grinding rocks into a fine-grained crystalline powder, often rich in calcium carbonate. It's light and the wind easily kicks it up and blows it hundreds and sometimes thousands of miles across the earth. Once it lands and is deposited, its silt-sized grains link together resulting in a highly porous yet well-structured soil that retains moisture while allowing for excellent drainage and root penetration. These often form sturdy bluffs and hills that, as they are susceptible to erosion, are easily shaped to build terracing slopes for viticulture, and for all you wannabe troglodytes, good for some cave digging.



Some famous European wine regions are filled with the stuff. It's all over in Austria's Wachau, Kremstal, Kamptal, Wagram and Traisental; France's Northern Rhône appellations where it dominates the central and eastern side of Hermitage, as well as parts of Crozes-Hermitage mostly toward the east of this expansive appellation, though a little bit in the north sliver along the former riverbanks where it sits on top of the Pangean-era granite.

Loess seems to increase a wine's immediate appeal. It also has a strong track record for wines that age well. At the risk of generalizing, wines grown from loess are often richer and rounder, softer and more agreeable, with an exuberant aromatic lift.

When all the elements of the ecosystem are in perfect harmony, wines develop their distinctive character that only nature can bring forth. Rupert Summerer: Rupert was born into a long lineage of winemakers and, though his dream growing up wasn't to take over the family estate, he nonetheless became the next generation. Davis Weszeli joined the winery in 2011 as a partner, at which time the estate was renamed. They practice organic viticulture and in the cellar they treat each wine based on its own unique character. The Weszeli estate is situated in the Kamptal region of Austria, where the summer days are hot and the cooler Northwest winds bring the cold, causing high diurnal fluctuations. The soils are a mix of loess, gneiss, and clay and the long growing season and sunny autumn days allow the grapes to reach full physiological maturity.

A single mother since the birth of her two sons, Felix and Max, she steadily and quite remarkably advanced the quality of her family estate. Her vineyards are an interesting mix of limestone, mica schist, and crystalline quartz, which offers her range of wines a great deal of breadth and depth, and a multitude of compelling textures and mineral/metal impressions to go with their overt charm and exuberant personalities. Her vineyards are in Leitha Mountains on a gentle, southeast slope facing Lake Neusiedl. Her Zweigelt "Mitterjoch" is grown on schist soil and fermented in stainless steel that further encourages Zweigelt's naturally bright and fresh red qualities. Classically darker and more textured, her Blaufränkisch wines are grown on limestone soils. Heide - named after the vineyard - comes from young vines and spends one year in old barrels. Leithaberg, from the old vines of the Heide and Glauberiza vineyards, has a lengthier wood aging and offers much greater complexity.

The German organic and biodynamic winegrower, Katharina Wechsler, has officially arrived. The owner of enviable holdings in the most famous dry Riesling area of the Rheinhessen (thanks to the local luminaries, Klaus-Peter Keller, and Philipp Wittman), the highlights in her stable include a big slab of the grand cru vineyard, Kirchspiel, and a small chunk of perhaps the most coveted of all recognized grand crus, Morstein. Between these two juggernaut vineyards of dry Riesling, her family owns entirely a large vineyard, called Benn. Only the upper section of Benn on the strongly calcareous sections is planted to Riesling, while much of the lower slopes are a patchwork of many different grape varieties that she loves to play with in her cellar, concocting things that range between pure pleasure and fun, savory orange wines, to more serious classically styled dry wines, like her knockout Scheurebe. The entry-level trocken Riesling will give any dry Riesling in all of Germany a run for the money but showcases the lifted and elegant exotic characteristics of Riesling only found in this part of the world.





FROM ROCK TO RHÔNE



If you had asked a young Eric Solomon what he wanted to do when he grew up, Eric would have told you he wanted to be a rock drummer or, if earshot of his parents, a classically-trained percussionist. At 18, he arrived in London to understudy with the principal percussionist for the London Symphony Orchestra but spent as much time drumming for several underground rock bands. It was pure luck that, walking into his neighborhood wine bar looking for a job, Eric would discover his true vocation. Starting as a bartender, Eric caught the proprietor's attention for his aptitude and eagerness to learn, and soon, he was making selections for the wine list. In short order, he was sponsored to the Institute of Masters of Wine, where Eric excelled in its rigorous course of study. Unfortunately, his studies ended when the UK government realized he had overstayed his visa.

Arriving home, he settled in Manhattan and quickly found employment as the Director of Fine Wines for a Fortune 100 Wine and Spirits company, learning much that would serve him well when he founded European Cellars in 1990. From the start, Eric championed unheralded wine-growing regions and promoted young, innovative winemakers. His initial focus was France, where he was an early proponent of the wines of the Rhône, the Languedoc, and the Roussillon. His growing reputation in Europe as a new, dynamic, and successful importer prompted Daphne Glorian to send him an unsolicited sample of her wine, Clos Erasmus, in 1993. This wine would change Eric's life professionally and personally.

Daphne had a similarly unconventional path to wine. Initially, she trained in the law, and while working in the Paris office of an English Master of Wine, she met Rene Barbier. Moving to the Priorat in 1988 at the urging of Rene, she invested her life's savings in 17 terraces of vines near the village of Gratallops, thereby becoming one of the founders of the modern Priorat. Daphne established her own cellar, Clos i Terrasses, and became the first winemaker in Spain to achieve back-to-back perfect scores in 2004 & 2005 for Clos Erasmus. In the intervening years, she not only met her enthusiastic American importer but eventually agreed to marry him. Together, they began to explore the rest of Spain, assembling a Spanish portfolio as innovative and distinctive as his imports from France.

Eric Solomon Selections has grown from a few estates to over 100 properties. In addition to his original import portfolio, Eric established Indigo Wine in 2015 with a collection of smaller estates from emerging regions or young growers shaking up established appellations in France, Spain, and further afield.

For his pioneering efforts, Robert Parker has recognized Eric as his Wine Personality of the Year for 2002, remarking, "Solomon has a great talent for ferreting out spectacular wines from France and Spain. The quality of these selections is remarkable." In 2006, he was awarded Best Importer of the Year by Food and Wine Magazine, and he has been a James Beard semifinalist for Outstanding Wine and Spirits Professional in 2009, 2010, and 2011. In celebration of European Cellars' 25th anniversary, Robert Parker followed on his earlier praise, writing, "I first tasted with Eric in 1991/1992, and I have watched him grow as an importer to the point where he may be the finest in the United States."

ANJOU - VALLÉE DE LA LOIRE

The Anjou Noir has been witness to a quiet revolution in the last two decades as young growers have reinvented the possibilities of this historical terroir. The Anjou Loire had long relied on its reputation for making some of France's most dependable sweet wines, most notably those from Grand Cru Chaume, or most notoriously, Rosé d'Anjou. Now growers are taking advantage of a mix of ancient volcanic terroirs to make stunningly complex dry Chenin Blancs, mineral and focused Cabernet Francs and pleausurably exuberant wines from Grolleau and Gamay. Among this pioneering group is Thomas & Charlotte Carsin of Terre de l'Elu. Arriving in 2008 with the purchase of a 22-hectare estate that used to sell their grapes to the local cooperative, they immediately began the transition to organic and biodynamic farming. Half of their production is dedicated to Chenin Blanc and Cabernet Franc with Gamay, Grolleau Noir & Gris, Pineau d'Aunis and Sauvignon Blanc making up the rest.

SAVENNIÈRES - VALLÉE DE LA LOIRE

Part of the new wave of vigneron in Savennières, which is redefining this tiny appellation's style, Damien's illustrious peers include Eric Morgat and Thibaud Boudignon. For generations, Savennières was defined by a stern, backwardness that slowly unfurled with age to reveal a tonic minerality and the fleeting flavors of ripe apple and honeyed almonds. Achieving this ephemeral glory required selective purchasing, proper storage, and the ability to leave the wine alone for a decade or three. Damien & co. have proved that this needn't be the only path to greatness in Savennières and that ripe Chenin (when it turns golden with black flecks on the skins) could produce wines of immediate charm without sacrificing age-ability. What sets Damien apart is rather than making lieu-dit-based bottlings, he's crafting his cuvées from similar soils and subsoils - sandstone shale (*L'Alliance*), phtanite (*Les Genêts*), mica-schist transitioning to rhyolite (*Le Bel Ouvrage*), pure rhyolite (*Champ Bourcier*), and dark schists and shales (*La Roche aux Moines*).

YANNICK AMIRAULT

BOURGUEIL & SAINT-NICOLAS-DE-BOURGUEIL - VALLÉE DE LA LOIRE

Yannick and Benoît Amirault have dispensed with the question of the difference between Bourgueil and Saint-Nicolas-de-Bourgueil by skipping over the debate entirely. Instead, they focus almost entirely on lieu-dit bottlings. Nearly that is, apart from Côte 50 (four closely grouped sites) and Equinoxe Rosé (a selection based on the vintage). This vineyard-first ethos was present when Yannick founded his estate in 1977 and has carried through to his son, Benoît. It is represented by their early adoption of organic farming in the 1990s, hand-harvesting each site in successive passes, indigenous fermentations, gentle and lengthy macerations, and aging in a mix of seasoned French oak demi-muids, oak vats, and amphorae. Purity, tension, and length are counterpoints to the harmony of fruit and tannin in all their cuvées, allowing you to taste each site's terroir. By centering place over appellation, you can begin to see that the shared, predominantly south-facing slope and its associated terroirs have a far greater impact on the character of each of their cuvées than their village designation.

A fair amount of discourse about wine is framed in dichotomies that can leave out much of the nuance that makes wine so fascinating. Every generation experiences some movement that casts heroes and villains in this endless cycle of righteousness and iniquity. The Paumel family of Château de Mourre du Tendre has existed outside these debates since the early 20th century, which makes visiting them and tasting their wines an opportunity to step outside of time. They do not pursue change, nor do they avoid its necessity. Vines are replaced when they die, and only with a massale selection from the same parcel, so their vines are old, quite old, and very old. Paul Verité makes wines as his grandfather did - whole-cluster, co-fermentations once carbonic maceration transitions into a traditional fermentation. When this occurs, gentle pigeage continues daily until fermentation is complete. After pressing, they rest in tank for three years. By practice, these might be the most traditional Rhône wines in our portfolio or the most modern in their resolutely idiosyncratic nature. What cannot be denied is that these are some of the most unique Southern Rhône wines you're likely to find.

CLOS SAINT ANTONIN

Long in the shadow of her father Aimé and brother Christophe at Domaine de la Janasse, one could only speculate what Isabelle added to the family's wines. With Clos Saint Antonin, we finally have an answer. Purchased by Isabelle and Aimé in 2014, Clos Saint Antonin is a contiguous estate in Plan de Dieu that occupies a crest of deep gravel over layers of sand and fine clay. Row by row, the soils change, and the rock pile of quartzite at the top thins to reveal what one could reasonably call soil. While her Plan de Dieu and Côtes-du-Rhône are contrasts in power and winsome charm, they share an ethereal mineral persistence. That both could come from adjacent parcels reveals Isabelle's sensitivity to the vineyard and confidence in the cellar to let them express themselves. Stepping out of the shadows, Isabelle makes her wines with more whole clusters, fermentations are strictly spontaneous, SO₂ has been reduced, and she's leading her family's efforts in converting both Domaine de la Janasse and Clos Saint Antonin to certified organic farming.

A few months before the pandemic shut everything down, I was tromping through Julien Brechet's vineyards. While a fairly contiguous estate situated in the foothills of the southwestern edge of the Dentelles, even my relatively untrained eye could notice subtle changes in the soils within his parcels and from plot to plot. For the ever-inquisitive Julien, these same changes were revealed as he increasingly made separate fermentations guided by terroir and parcel. The overwhelming majority of his production in Gigondas goes into his Gigondas Réserve, which marries the various articulations of his terroirs and the complexity of varietal expression in each. Through the evolution of the wines in the cellar, he will select a few barrels (always well-seasoned) or a portion from a foudre or concrete tank to bottled with the name of its corresponding lieu-dit. These are not shy wines, but they never feel overwrought. They capture Julien's gregarious and thoughtful personality, the wildness of the Dentelles, and the assured presence of his historic estate.

Brunnhilde Claux is the most un-Minervois winemaker you're likely to meet, and while her estate is almost entirely within La Livinière, it is also resolutely not La Livinière. Her neighbors have decided to showcase La Livinière's cooler microclimate by focusing on Syrah. For Brunnhilde, it's an opportunity to pick all her grapes fully ripe at lower potential alcohol. She learned this method at Domaine de Gauby, honed it at Terroir al Limit, and perfected it at Courbissac. Before anyone was talking about infusion instead of maceration, Brunnhilde was doing it, and for someone who is far happier in the vineyard than the cellar, her indigenous fermentations with plenty of whole clusters never show that happy-shinny-people qualities of the wine world's most recent fad. Instead, you get sinewy and lengthy wines that have the plushness of the South melded seamlessly to the upright backbone of the North.

Curro Bareño and Jesús Olivares didn't set out to be rule breakers but like many innovative and restless winemakers of their generation in Spain, they believed the honest voice of the vineyard should not be restrained by DO regulations. When they founded Fedellos do Couto in 2013, they focused on the Val do Sil and Val do Bibei subzones of Ribeira Sacra and their minimalist take on cooler sites was frequently challenged by the DO as atypical. A second label, Peixes, was created a few years later from newly rediscovered sites at the upper extremes of the Bibei south of Valdeorras and Ribeira Sacra. With their withdrawal from the DO after years of trying to make room for their style of wine, they merged both their projects as just Fedellos – the brats in Gallego. A fitting name for these inspired refusniks.

A native of Toro, Alvar de Dios learned his trade in the Sierra de Gredos under the guidance of Dani & Fer of Comando G before creating his own project from his grandfather's vineyards on the sandy soils of El Pego. Alvar's first few vintages of Tio Uco and Aciano were revolutionary takes on Toro wines so lithe, fluid, and refreshing that the eventual ban from the D.O. only surprised us for taking as long as it did. When the time came to grow so he could quit his day job in the Gredos as Fer's cellar master at Marañones, he had already assembled several parcels of traditionally co-planted vineyards in Arribes that were ideally suited to his ethereal style of winemaking. The indigeous varieties of Arribes Doña Blanca, Rufete, Juan García, Trincadeira Preta and Merenzao may seem to have little in common with Tinta de Toro, in Alvar's hands it all makes complete sense.

Bodegas Luis Pérez is Jerez's most traditional estate and revolutionary estate. Luis was the former director of winemaking at Domecq, while Willy is a leading proponent of resurrecting the pre-industrial Vino de Pasto style of winemaking in Jerez - unfortified wines, harvested in successive passes, dried under the sun for a short period, spontaneous fermentations and aging under flor. Nothing is fortified with Luis and Willy relying on the ripeness of the grapes and their biologic aging to arrive at the same intensity and complexity as what most would consider traditional Sherry. There is a throughline from their Vino de Pasto El Muelle and Escribana to Villamarta rooted in fully realized and terroir-inflected white wines that evolve through the influence of aging under flor. Through his research, Willy also discovered that Tintilla was once more widely planted and appreciated in Jerez and he's brought it back to three of their pagos. If you're interested in the future of Jerez, its past, or simply terruño-based wines, these are wines worth discovering.

Among the Garnachistas in Spain, Fernando Mora needs little introduction as his work at Frontonio since 2013 has established him as one of Spain's finest interpreters of nuanced and soulful Garnacha. A few years after establishing Frontonio, he launched Cuevas de Arom to seek out additional parcels of Garnacha in Aragon with the potential for unique and distinctive expression. Initially based in Campo de Borja, struggles with the D.O. there led to a visit with Yolanda Diaz of Bodegas San Alejandro in Calatayud. Shortly after the visit, Fernando relocated Cuevas de Arom to a specialty-built garage winery within the cooperative's larger facility. It might seem an odd partnership, but Yolanda and Fernando share a similar vision for Garnacha in Aragon - exceptional quality regardless of price, sustainable farming, fair prices for grape growers, transparent and minimalist winemaking, and a desire to showcase Garnacha's ability to be a profoundly terruño-driven wine.

TERROIR SENSE FRONTERES

MONT SANT - SPAIN

Making wines in the Priorat has always been a struggle against the extreme climate, steep hillsides, poor soils, and a conservative approach to grape growing and winemaking common in the region. Being committed to organic and biodynamic farming combined with non-extractive winemaking, the two outsiders (Dominik from Germany and Tatjana from Serbia) must toil even harder to remain on the DOQ's good side. Turning their attention to the DO of Montsant, Dominik, and Tatjana found a diversity of *terruño* and a more liberal attitude about farming and winemaking. So, in 2017, they created Terroir Sense Fronteres from a small selection of vineyard sites in Serra de Montsant. With more flexible DO rules, their preference for sheltered sites, and their natural inclination for expressive and lively wines, the offerings from Terroir Sense Fronteres are slightly lower in alcohol and lighter in color than what they make in the Priorat. Still, they share the same vinous persistence, haunting aromas, mineral depths, and fruit precision. They make two village wines – a white called *Brisat* and a red called *Negre*. In addition, there are currently three single terroir wines, *Vèrtebra* from La Figuera, just to the west of Priorat, and *Marcenca* and *Guix Vermell* from a vineyard close to Les Manyes but just over the border in Montsant.

Some people retire quietly into a more leisurely life of low-stakes hobbies somewhere warm, someplace where the pace of life is as slow and measured. Marcelo Retamal has a unique take on retirement. Upon leaving DeMartino after years at the forefront of Chile's evolution into an exciting wine culture, Reta finds himself at the helm of at least four new projects – *Vinédos de Alcohuaz*, *Granito País*, a new project in the Sierra de Salamanca in Spain, and *RETA*. Having made wine from over 350 parcels over his career, *RETA* is based on three of his favorites. A Chardonnay and Pinot from Limari and a *pie franco* Malbec-based field blend from Maule. All three are naked expressions of the interplay of grape variety and place brought about by all the lessons Reta has learned since the 1990s – harvesting just at the point of maturity, native yeast fermentations, and aging in neutral French oak barrels.
